13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, law enforcement officers often risk their lives to be the peacekeepers of our communities; and
17 18	WHEREAS, in 1998, 138 police officers across the nation were killed in the line of duty; and
19 20	WHEREAS, in Alaska, a total of 32 police officers have sacrificed their lives since statehood, of which Anchorage has lost six officers; and
21 22 23 24	14 WHEREAS, on Friday, May 15 , 1999, Alaska will observe its eleventh annual Police Memorial Day which coincides with National Police Memorial Day - a national day of remembrance for law enforcement officers; and
25 26 27	WHEREAS, law enforcement officers, both in Alaska and across the nation, will observe this day by wearing a black band on their badge to remember and honor their fallen fellow officers; and
28 29	WHEREAS, in Anchorage, a ceremony will be held honoring officers killed in the line of duty
30 31 32	NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:
