**A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING MAY ¹⁴~~45~~, 1999,
AS "POLICE MEMORIAL DAY"**

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers often risk their lives to be the peacekeepers of our communities; and

WHEREAS, in 1998, 138 police officers across the nation were killed in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, in Alaska, a total of 32 police officers have sacrificed their lives since statehood, of which Anchorage has lost six officers; and

WHEREAS, on Friday, May ¹⁴~~15~~, 1999, Alaska will observe its eleventh annual Police Memorial Day which coincides with National Police Memorial Day - a national day of remembrance for law enforcement officers; and


WHEREAS, law enforcement officers, both in Alaska and across the nation, will observe this day by wearing a black band on their badge to remember and honor their fallen fellow officers; and

WHEREAS, in Anchorage, a ceremony will be held honoring officers killed in the line of duty


NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:
