WHEREAS, the Center has been made possible by many public and private individuals,
corporations, and institutions including: Senator Ted Stevens and the Alaska Congressional delegation;
U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; U.S. Department of Commerce; National Park
Service; National Endowment for the Arts; National Endowment for the Humanities; the 13 Native regional
corporations especially Cook Inlet Region, Inc. and its President Carl Marrs; Alaska Federation of Natives;
Alaska Governor Tony Knowles, Anchorage Mayor Rick Mystrom; National Bank of Alaska; First National
Bank of Anchorage; countless private Alaskan businesses, the Heritage Board of Directors and capital
