**A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY URGING THE  
ADMINISTRATION TO REINSTATE BUS ROUTE 90**

---

WHEREAS, during the 1999 budget savings and 2000 budget reduction exercise, the Public Transportation Department deleted bus routes 90, 91, and 92 identifying these routes as the lowest year-round routes in the People Mover System; and

WHEREAS, bus route 90 provides an integral service to our citizens.

Route 90 is the only route south of 36<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Arctic and Old Seward;

Route 90 is the only bus service to 76<sup>th</sup> Avenue/Foxridge community which is a growing neighborhood with 80 new condominium units just being completed;

Route 90 also served the communities between C Street and Arctic (since trying to cross Arctic is perilous after disembarking from bus route 9 on the west side of Arctic);

Route 90 served as a commuter bus taking people to/from work (there were a couple of runs in the morning and a couple of runs in the late afternoon to accommodate workers); and

WHEREAS, the State just invested in new pullouts for the bus as part of the C Street road expansion between Tudor and Raspberry.

WHEREAS, reinstatement of Route 90, even if just for the morning and evening work commute, would be very beneficial.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves.

**Section 1:** That the Administration is urged to reinstate People Mover bus service on Route 90.

**Section 2:** That route 90 be included in the Public Transportation Department's Year 2000 budget.
