AO 2000-12 7 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALI-FIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE 8 ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED FIFTY-SEVEN MILLION NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$57,095,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION 9 BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY 10 OF ANCHORAGE AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY 11 OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 4, 2000. THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS: 12

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage (the "Municipality") to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Fifty-Seven Million Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$57,095,000), for the purpose of paying the costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within the Municipality including, but not limited to, the following

Section 2. The sum of not to exceed Fifty-Seven Million Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$57,095,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality for the aforesaid school capital improvements and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for

capital improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due.

Section 3. An election is to be held on April 4, 2000, in and for the Municipality of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

## **EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS**

Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$57,095,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds?

The general obligation bond proceeds will be used to pay costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within Anchorage. The proposed educational capital improvement projects include, but are not limited to, the following:
