12	THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 4, 2000.
13	THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:
14	Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public
15	interest of the Municipality of Anchorage to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness
16	in an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) for the
17	purpose of paying the costs of upgrading the Anchorage Police Department radio
18	communication systems and acquiring and installing an automatic vehicle locate system
19	and related police protection capital improvements within the Anchorage Metropolitan
20	Police Service Area
21	Section 2. The sum of not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
22	(\$750,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality of Anchorage for
23	the aforesaid public safety (police protection) and related police protection capital

improvements, and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of

the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for capital improvements and

costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged

for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon

all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or

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amount to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due. The principal of and
 interest on the bonds are to be paid first from general ad valorem taxes levied and
 collected within the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area.

<u>Section 3</u>. An election is to be held on April 4, 2000, in and for the Municipality
of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the
qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must
receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question, both in the
Metropolitan Anchorage Police Service Area and areawide, to be approved. The
proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

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## **PROPOSITION NO.**

## ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA PUBLIC SAFETY (POLICE PROTECTION) AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$750,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds to pay costs of upgrading communication systems, acquiring and installing an automatic vehicle locate system and related police protection capital improvements within the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area? These capital improvements would be located in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area.

 The annual increase in taxes on \$100,000 of assessed real and personal property value (based on the estimated 2000, assessed valuation in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area) necessary to retire the proposed debt is approximately \$0.91.

The debt shall be paid first from real and personal property taxes levied and collected in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the bonds.
