ORDINANCE NO. AO 2000-19

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,525,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF PARKS AND RECREATION AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE EAGLE RIVER-CHUGIAK PARKS AND RECREATION SERVICE AREA AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 4, 2000.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed One Million Five Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,525,000) for the purpose of paying costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, equipping and constructing park improvements, recreational facilities, trail upgrades and related capital improvements within the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area.

Section 2. The sum of One Million Five Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,525,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality of Anchorage for the aforesaid parks and recreation capital improvements and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for capital improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property within the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest

on the bonds when due. The principal of and interest on the bonds are to be paid first from general ad valorem taxes levied and collected within the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area

Section 3. An election is to be held on April 4, 2000, in and for the Municipality of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question, both in the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area and areawide, to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

EAGLE RIVER-CHUGIAK PARKS AND RECREATION SERVICE AREA CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

* (Insert paragraph 3 as paragraph 1)
Shall the Municipality of Anchorage borrow up to \$1,525,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds to pay costs of equipping and constructing park improvements, recreational facilities, trail upgrades and related capital improvements within the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area?

The annual amount of taxes on \$100,000 of assessed taxable property value (based on the estimated total 2000 assessed valuation in the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area) necessary to retire the proposed debt is \$7.61. \$8.20.

* The debt/shall be paid first from real and personal property taxes levied and collected within the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the bonds.

PUBLIC SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

POSITIONS: FT/PT and Temp.

Estimated annual debt service of \$123,400 assumes bonds are sold as a package @ 6.0% interest, with bond repayments corresponding to the expected life of the assets financed; 20 years.

Increased annual operations and maintenance costs are estimated at \$33,300.

PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:

Estimated annual debt service payments of approximately \$123,400 equate to an estimated property tax increase of .0761 mills or \$7.61 per year on \$100,000 of assessed valuation in the Eagle River-Chugiak Parks & Recreation Service Area.

Increased annual operations and maintenance costs are estimated at \$33,300; these costs will be absorbed and voters will not be asked to increase the Municipal tax cap limitation.

The only private sector effect would therefore be the increase in the Municipal tax cap limitation related to the payment of debt service as described above.
