Section 2. The sum of not to exceed Seventy-Seven Nine Hundred Thousand 1 Dollars (\$77.900.000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality for the 2 aforesaid school capital improvements and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general 3 obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for capital 4 improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the 5 Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and 6 ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without 7 limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due. 8

Section 3. An election is to be held on April 4, 2000, in and for the Municipality of
Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the
qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection The proposition must receive
a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question to be approved. The
proposition shall be substantially in the following form

EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

Shall Anchorage borrow up to **\$77,900,000** through the issuance of general obligation bonds?

The general obligation bond proceeds will be used to pay costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within Anchorage. The proposed educational capital improvement projects include, but are not limited to, the following:
