THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: That the FY 2000-2001 proposed Anchorage School District budget in the amount of \$410,505,754 has been approved and appropriated by the Anchorage Assembly and that, of said amount, the amount of \$116,540,396 \$119,492,622 shall be the amount of money to be appropriated from local property taxes or other local sources for school purposes to fund the School District for its 2000-2001 fiscal year.

Section 2: That it is the intent of the Assembly to consider the addition of up to \$8,000,000 to the FY 2000-2001 Anchorage School District budget and to the amount of money appropriated from local property taxes or other local sources for school purposes to fund the School District for its FY 2000-2001 fiscal year in the event 99PTAR, "An Act Providing Property Tax and Assessment Relief," is not approved by the voters or otherwise not put into effect.

Section 3: That this ordinance is effective upon passage and approval.

Section 2: That the FY 2000-2001 Anchorage School District budget approved and appropriated by Section 1. of this ordinance is hereby revised by increasing the total amount of said budget by \$8,000,000 and the amount of money -1by the additional sum of \$5,047, $\frac{477}{774}$ and the amount of money appropriated from local property taxes and/or other local sources for said budget

Section 3: That Sections 1. and 3. of this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly. Section 2. of this ordinance shall become effective on the date the Lieutenant Governor of Alaska certifies the November, 2000 regular State election if, but only if, the State of Alaska Initiative Petition 99PTAR, "An Act Providing for Property Tax and Assessment Relief", is not passed by voters at said election.
