

Subject: Amending AMC Title 26 - Enacting a New Chapter 26.75 Regarding

Recycling

In April 1997, the Assembly approved AR 97-95 requesting the Administration to establish a Recycling and Waste Reduction Task Force to develop a plan for a comprehensive waste reduction and recycling program for the Municipality of Anchorage.

After three years of intensive work, the Task Force developed a waste reduction and recycling management plan and recently presented the plan to the Assembly for adoption. In developing the plan, which reflects the community's desire to increase recycling services while keeping costs low, the Task Force:

Worked hard to design a realistic plan to help the community implement cost effective and sustainable waste reduction and recycling programs; and

Solicited public comments on the plan through a community open house, meetings with interested community council members, and written comments.

Overall, there is strong, broad-based support for the plan, with favorable comments received from citizen and conservation groups, individual residents, and organizations representing local small businesses and the transportation sector.

The Assembly believes that the plan should be adopted as the general guidance for policy, legislation, and financial decisions related to recycling throughout the Municipality of Anchorage.

Approval of this ordinance is recommended.
