ORDINANCE NO. AO 2000-103

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE. ALASKA. RESCINDING AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE CERTAIN OBLIGATION BONDS AUTHORIZED, BUT UNISSUED, PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE NUMBERS AO 97-21(S), AO 97-27(S), AO 96-28, AO 96-26, AO 90-104 AND AO 87-90; AND RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. AO 97-21(S) of the Municipality of Anchorage (the "Municipality") was passed and approved by the Municipal Assembly on February 11, 1997 (herein called "AO 97-21(S)"), which put before the authorized voters of the Municipality a bond ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$425,000 of general obligation bonds for purposes of financing capital improvements associated with areawide emergency medical services and ambulances (herein called "Proposition No. 97-6"); and

WHEREAS, Proposition 97-6 was passed and approved by the authorized voters of the Municipality on April 15, 1997, and said election has been duly canvassed and results thereof certified and confirmed in accordance with law, and \$300,000 principal amount of said general obligation bonds remain authorized but unissued under Proposition No. 97-6; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. AO 97-27(S) of the Municipality was passed and approved by the Municipal Assembly on February 11, 1997 (herein called "AO 97-27(S)"), which put before the authorized voters of the Municipality a bond ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$370,000 of general obligation bonds for purposes of financing capital improvements associated with the Girdwood Fire Station (herein called "Proposition No. 97-9"); and

WHEREAS, Proposition 97-9 was passed and approved by the authorized voters

of the Municipality on April 15, 1997, and said election has been duly canvassed and results thereof certified and confirmed in accordance with law, and \$55,000 principal amount of said general obligation bonds remain authorized but unissued under Proposition No. 97-6; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. AO 96-28 of the Municipality was passed and approved by the Municipal Assembly on February 13, 1996 (herein called "AO 96-28"), which put before the authorized voters of the Municipality a bond ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$950,000 of general obligation bonds for purposes of financing capital improvements associated with areawide emergency medical services (herein called "Proposition No. 96-1"); and

WHEREAS, Proposition 96-1 was passed and approved by the authorized voters of the Municipality on April 16, 1996, and said election has been duly canvassed and results thereof certified and confirmed in accordance with law, and \$450,000 principal amount of said general obligation bonds remain authorized but unissued under Proposition No. 96-1; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. AO 96-26 of the Municipality was passed and approved by the Municipal Assembly on February 13, 1996 (herein called "AO 96-26"), which put before the authorized voters of the Municipality a bond ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$900,000 of general obligation bonds for purposes of financing capital improvements associated with police protection services (herein called "Proposition No. 96-6"); and

WHEREAS, Proposition 96-6 was passed and approved by the authorized voters of the Municipality on February 13, 1996, and said election has been duly canvassed and results thereof certified and confirmed in accordance with law, and \$900,000 principal amount of said general obligation bonds remain authorized but unissued under Proposition No. 96-6; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. AO 90-104 of the Municipality was passed and approved by the Municipal Assembly on August 14, 1990 (herein called "AO 90-104"), which put before the authorized voters of the Municipality a bond ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$1,940,000 of general obligation bonds for purposes of financing capital improvements associated with police protection services (herein called "Proposition No. 90-12"); and

WHEREAS, Proposition 90-12 was passed and approved by the authorized voters of the Municipality on October 2, 1990, and said election has been duly canvassed and results thereof certified and confirmed in accordance with law, and \$225,000 principal amount of said general obligation bonds remain authorized but unissued under Proposition No. 90-12; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. AO 87-90 of the Municipality was passed and approved by the Municipal Assembly on August 11, 1987 (herein called "AO 87-90"), which put before the authorized voters of the Municipality a bond ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of not to exceed \$7,500,000 of general obligation bonds for purposes of financing capital improvements associated with the redevelopment of the area surrounding the Port of Anchorage (herein called "Proposition No. 87-2"); and

WHEREAS, Proposition 87-2 was passed and approved by the authorized voters of the Municipality on October 6, 1987, and said election has been duly canvassed and results thereof certified and confirmed in accordance with law, and \$5,500,000 principal amount of said general obligation bonds remain authorized but unissued under Proposition No. 87-2; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable and in the best interest of the Municipality and its inhabitants to rescind the authorization of the Municipality to issue the authorized, but unissued, principal amount of general obligation bonds referred to in Proposition No. 97-6, Proposition No. 97-9, Proposition No. 96-1, Proposition No. 96-6,

Proposition No. 90-12, and Proposition No. 87-2.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ORDAINS

Section 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Ordinance is to rescind the authorization to issue the following authorized, but unissued, general obligation bonds in the amounts noted:

Section 2 Rescinding of Authorization to Issue General Obligation Bonds Ordinance. The Municipality does hereby rescind the authorization to issue the authorized but unissued, general obligation bonds pursuant to Ordinance Nos. AO 97-21(S), AO 97-27(S), AO 96-28, AO 96-26, AO 90-104 and AO 87-90 and as outlined above in Section 1. The Municipality may take no further action under Ordinance Nos. AO 97-21(S), AO 97-27(S), AO 96-28, AO 96-26, AO 90-104 and AO 87-90.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
