Subject: Amending AMC Section 2.30.030, Regarding the Order of Business at Assembly Meetings

Public input is critical to the Assembly's decisionmaking process. Currently, the Assembly meeting agenda offers three opportunities for individuals to access and speak to their Assemblymembers: appearance requests, public hearings and audience participation. Appearance requests are arranged in advance through the Clerk's Office, with specific speakers and topics, and are heard between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Public hearings are held on those items requiring such a hearing and the hearings must start no later than 7:30 p.m. Audience participation is held near the end of the agenda, and the public can address the Assembly on any topic without any pre-arrangements.

The "Audience participation" portion of the Assembly agenda is currently listed behind "Special orders", "Assembly comments", and "Unfinished business". Given this order of business, on many occasions, the Assembly never gets to audience participation prior to adjournment.

The Assembly should make every effort to ensure that the "Audience participation" portion of its agenda is held. To assist in this effort, this proposed ordinance changes the order of business at Assembly meetings by moving "Audience participation" before "Assembly comments".

Also, this proposed ordinance moves "Unfinished agenda" before "Audience
participation" and "Assembly comments"; adds a clarifying note that new public
hearings will begin no earlier than 6:00 p.m. (requested by the Municipal Clerk's Office);
and removes provisions regarding time sensitive items.

Approval of this ordinance is recommended.
