## AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 21.45.110 TO ALLOW FOR FRONT YARD FENCES TO BE UP TO EIGHT FEET IN HEIGHT IN ZONING DISTRICTS R-6, R-8, AND R-9 WHEN THE FENCING MATERIAL IS NON-SIGHT OBSCURING

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1:</u> That Section 21.45.110 of the Anchorage Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

## <u>21.45.110</u> Fences.

A. A fence may be constructed at the lot line, provided, however, that front yard fences in residential zoning districts shall not exceed four feet in height, except in zoning districts R-6, R-8 and R-9 where front yard fences shall not exceed six feet in height. <u>Front yard fences</u> <u>may be increased to eight feet in height in zoning districts R-6, R-8 and R-9 provided the</u> <u>fencing material is non-sight obscuring. Examples of non-sight obscuring fencing</u> <u>include chain-link fencing, and split rail. No front yard fence shall be erected in conflict</u> <u>with Section 21.45.020, clear vision areas.</u>

B. In the case of a through lot, as defined in Section 21.35.020.B, which abuts a street of collector 1, 1A or greater classification as designated on the official streets and highways plan, a fence may be constructed within the secondary front yard abutting the street up to a maximum of eight feet in height, provided that vehicular access to the street is prohibited. A fence higher than four feet, or six feet in zoning districts R-6, R-8 and R-9, shall not be constructed if access to the street is required due to a plat note, by a conditional use permit or under other provisions of law.

Section 2: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage and approval.
