AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.45.050 REGARDING SURCHARGES ON TICKETS SOLD AT THE GEORGE M. SULLIVAN SPORTS ARENA

## THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: That Section 10.45.050 of the Anchorage Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

A. There is hereby imposed upon every person who pays an admission charge to any amusement, entertainment or event held in the George M. Sullivan Sports Arena for which a firm booking was made after <u>December 31, 2000, a surcharge as follows:</u>

- 1. A \$1.00 surcharge for all tickets issued to a spectator event, except for promoter comps at a number equal to 2% of building capacity for the event, and except for trade shows and family shows;
- 2. A \$0.50 surcharge for all adult tickets issued for family shows. Family shows are defined as events that are expected to be attended by at least one-third children, and have discounted (or free) admission for children 12 and under. No surcharge shall be assessed against children's tickets to family shows;
- 3. A \$0.50 surcharge against the drop count and/or attendance at nonspectator and trade show events. For religious and educational events, the surcharge will be capped at \$500.00;
- 4. Waive surcharge on children attending family shows (as identified in #2 above), and for all participants in Sullivan Arena youth camp activities.

[DECEMBER 31, 1985, A SURCHARGE OF \$0.25 ON TICKETS WITH A SALES PRICE OF \$10.00 OR LESS, AND \$0.50 ON TICKETS WITH A SALES PRICE IN EXCESS OF \$10.00.] Every person receiving an admission charge upon which surcharge is imposed under this section shall collect the amount of surcharge imposed upon the person paying an admission charge. The surcharge shall be deemed to be held in trust by the person

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required to collect the surcharge until remitted to the municipality as provided by regulation. The surcharge imposed under this section shall be collected at the time the admission charge is paid <u>or at the time of event settlement when no admission is paid.</u>


- B. The director of property and facility management shall, subject to section 6.30.060, be responsible for carrying out and enforcing the payment, collection and remittance of the surcharge imposed in this section.
- C. <u>The surcharge collected under subsection A. shall be distributed to capital and operating accounts as follows:</u>
  - 1. Fifty percent shall be distributed to the Sullivan Arena Capital Reserve Fund; and
  - 2. Fifty percent shall be distributed to operational revenues.

[ALL FUNDS COLLECTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSIDERED MISCELLANEOUS REVENUES OF THE MUNICIPALITY, AND NOT REVENUES OF THE GEORGE M. SULLIVAN SPORTS ARENA.]

Section 2: Upon passage and approval, this ordinance shall be effective January 1, 2001

SPORTS ARENA SPECIFICALLY RELATED TO INCREASES IN USE

**FEES AND TICKET SURCHARGES** 

The two ordinances, AO 2000-136 (amending AMC 10.45.050) and AO 2000-137 (amending AMCR 25.11), modify the fee structure at the George M. Sullivan Sports Arena.

The fees at the George M. Sullivan Sports Arena have not changed since the Arena opened in 1983. During the first 17 years of Arena operations, the original fee structure was adequate because revenues were increasing as a result of increasing business and the new facility required minimal major repair work.

Currently, the George M. Sullivan Sports Arena is fully utilized and in February entered its 18<sup>th</sup> year of operation. Since the Arena is at or near capacity, revenues are flat and are projected to remain so. This, combined with the fact that the facility is aging and requires increased levels of major maintenance projects, prompted the Arena staff and the Public Facilities Advisory Commission to recommend fee and surcharge increases at the Sullivan Arena. The combination of fee and surcharge increases proposed in these ordinance revisions would increase annual revenues by \$250,000 - \$300,000. This amount, along with current revenue generated by operations, is sufficient to fund an annual major maintenance and repair capital program of approximately \$450,000 per year, plus reduce the tax subsidy of the Sullivan Arena.

At a public hearing before the Public Facilities Commission, most users of the Arena expressed understanding of the need to increase the fees to cover additional facility costs.

In order to allow users time to plan for the proposed fee and surcharge increases, they would not become effective until January 2001.
