ORDINANCE NO. AO 2001-9

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF FOUR MILLION THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$4,365,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF FIRE PROTECTION AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE ANCHORAGE FIRE SERVICE AREA AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 3, 2001.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage, Alaska (the "Municipality") to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Four Million Three Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$4,365,000) for the purpose of paying the costs of acquiring property for and designing fire stations, communications upgrades and related fire protection capital improvements within the Anchorage Fire Service Area.

Section 2. The sum of not to exceed Four Million Three Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$4,365,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality for the aforesaid fire protection capital improvements and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for payment of capital improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest on the

bonds when due. The principal of and interest on the bonds are to be paid first from 1 2 general ad valorem taxes levied and collected within the Anchorage Fire Service Area. 3 Section 3. An election is to be held on April 3, 2001, in and for the Municipality, for 4 the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive a majority vote of 5 6 those in the Municipality voting on the question, both in the Anchorage Fire Service Area 7 and areawide, to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form: 8 PROPOSITION NO. ANCHORAGE FIRE SERVICE AREA FIRE PROTECTION 9 AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS 10 Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$4,365,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds to pay the costs of acquiring 11 property for and designing fire stations, communication 12 upgrades and related fire protection capital improvements? The proposed capital improvements would be located within 13 the Anchorage Fire Service Area. Voter approval of this bond proposition authorizes for each 14 \$100,000 of assessed taxable property value (based on the estimated 2001 assessed valuation in the Anchorage Fire 15 Service Area), an annual increase in taxes of approximately 2.64 to retire the proposed debt. 16 The debt shall be paid first from real and personal property 17 taxes levied and collected within the Anchorage Fire Service Area. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for 18 payment of the bonds. 19 (No. AO 2001-9) 20 Section 4. The proposition, both for paper ballots and machine ballots, shall be 21 printed on a ballot which may set forth other general obligation bond propositions, and the 22 following words shall be added as appropriate and next to a square provided for marking 23 the ballot or voting by a machine: 24 PROPOSITION NO.
