ORDINANCE NO. AO 2001-13

AN ORDINANCE SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS RESIDING IN THE MOUNTAIN PARK ESTATES LIMITED ROAD SERVICE AREA AT THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION APRIL 3, 2001 A BALLOT PROPOSITION APPROVING THE CONTINUATION OF SAID LIMITED ROAD SERVICE AREA FOR AN ADDITIONAL PERIOD OF THREE YEARS AND AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 27.20.250 AND 27.30.330.

WHEREAS THE Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service Area was created by Anchorage Ordinance 83-57; and

WHEREAS a showing of interest in continuing said limited road service beyond December 31 2001 has been made by persons residing in said limited road service area; now therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. That a ballot proposition in substantially the following form shall be submitted to the qualified voters residing in the Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service Area at the regular Municipal election on April 3, 2001:

CONTINUATION OF THE
MOUNTAIN PARK ESTATES LIMITED ROAD SERVICE AREA

Shall the existence of the Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service area be continued for an additional period of three (3) years after December 31, 2001 until December 31, 2004?

1 Section 2. That Section 27.20.250 of the Anchorage Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:

4 Pursuant to section 27.10.050, there is established a board of supervisors to administer the
5 Mountain Park Estates Limited Road Service Area. The board shall consist of three members
6 appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the Assembly to administer the service area until the
7 regular election of October 1984, at which time the supervisors will be elected for staggered terms.
8 Initial terms of supervisors elected at the regular election of October 1984 shall be selected by lot.
9 [THE SERVICE AREA WILL EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31, 2001, UNLESS IT IS EXTENDED
10 BY VOTE IN THE AREA AFFECTED AT THE REGULAR ELECTION OF APRIL 2001.]


12 Section 3. That Section 27.30.330 of the Anchorage Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as
13 follows:

15 There is a limited road service area within the municipality known as the Mountain Park
16 Estates Limited Road Service Area to provide limited road maintenance and repair to the area
17 described on the map located in section 27.30.700.
18

19 Limited road maintenance and repair within the service area shall commence on January 1,
20 1984, and shall end on December 31, [2001] 2004, unless the service area is extended by an
21 affirmative vote in the service area [AFFECTED] at the regular election of April [2001] 2004. The
22 mill rate shall not exceed 1.0 mill in any calendar year.

25 Section 4. Except for Section 3, this ordinance shall become effective upon passage and approval.
26 Section 3 and the proposition contained in Section 1 shall become effective upon certification of the
27 regular election on the proposition called for by this ordinance, but only if that proposition is
28 approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the proposition.

SUBJECT: Extension of Limited Road Service Areas

The Lakehill, Mountain Park Estates, Mountain Park/Robin Hill, Rabbit Creek View/Rabbit Creek Heights, Raven Woods/Bubbling Brook, Rockhill, Skyranch Estates, Totem, Upper Grover, and Valli Vue Estates Limited Road Service Areas expire on December 31, 2001 unless continued by an affirmative vote in the area affected. Therefore, ten ordinances have been presented requesting the Assembly propose ballot questions to extend the life of these LRSA's.

There will be no additional economic impact on the private or public sector.

Approval of the ordinances will place the propositions on the ballot for a vote at the April 3, 2001 Regular Election.
