AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE PROVIDING FOR SUBMISSION OF A BALLOT PROPOSITION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS AT THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON APRIL 03, 2001, PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HOME RULE CHARTER SECTION 13.05, ASSEMBLY ACTION ON THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET, CLARIFYING EXERCISE OF THE VETO POWER WITH RESPECT TO THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: That a ballot proposition in substantially the following form shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the Municipality at the regular Anchorage municipal election April 03, 2001:

**AMENDING AND CLARIFYING CHARTER SECTION §13.05, TO MAKE EXPLICIT
THE EFFECT OF THE ASSEMBLY'S FAILURE TO OVERRIDE
A MAYOR'S VETO OF A BUDGET ORDINANCE-ASSEMBLY ACTION ON THE MUNICIPAL
BUDGET**

Shall Anchorage Municipal Charter §13.05 be amended to read as follows:

(Underlined words are proposed new words [BRACKETED WORDS ARE PROPOSED DELETIONS].)

Section 13.05. Assembly action on the municipal budget.

The assembly may increase or decrease any item, and may add or delete items, in the proposed operating or capital budget of the municipality. The assembly shall approve the budget of the municipality as amended and appropriate the necessary funds at least 21 days prior to the end of the fiscal year of the municipality. If the assembly fails to approve the budget and make the necessary appropriation within the time stated, either before or by veto override after a veto of all or a portion of a budget, the Assembly shall hold such regular or special meetings as are necessary to adopt a budget and make the necessary appropriation. [THE BUDGET PROPOSAL SHALL BECOME THE BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR WITHOUT FURTHER ASSEMBLY ACTION.]

Section 2: The proposition contained in Section 1. of this ordinance shall become effective upon certification of the April 03, 2001 election if, and only if, it is approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the Proposition at said election. All other Sections of this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.
