AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE SUBLEASE OF APPROXIMATELY 8 ACRES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE SOUTH TIDELANDS LEASEHOLD TO ALASKA RAILROAD CORPORATION TO ACCOMMODATE THE INSTALLATION OF NEW RAIL TRACKS FOR OFFLOADING PETROLEUM PRODUCTS.

WHEREAS, on September 15, 1992, the Municipality of Anchorage exchanged a portion of its leasehold in Ship Creek Point by conveyance to the Alaska Railroad in exchange for a long term lease, ARRC Ground Lease Contract No. 6434, of approximately 103 acres of land known as the South Tidelands by AO 92-113. The Municipality of Anchorage pays no rent for the South Tidelands leasehold; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Railroad requests a sublease from the Municipality of Anchorage of approximately 8 acres in the South Tidelands leasehold to accommodate the installation of new rail tracks for offloading petroleum products; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Railroad will pay \$1.60 per square foot, the fair market value of the tidelands, in an annual payment of \$49,236.00 to the Municipality of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Railroad's installation of new rail tracks will eliminate traffic delays and congestion in the Port area, will reduce locomotive traffic and fuel consumption, will promote safety and efficiency by eliminating rail crossings over roadways in the Port of Anchorage, will provide additional improvements to the Municipality's tax base, and will enhance and promote economic development into the Municipality; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Municipality is hereby authorized to enter into a sublease of approximately 8 acres of its South Tidelands leasehold upon the following general terms and conditions, and delegates to the Mayor, or his designee, in his sole discretion, the authority to negotiate the remaining terms and conditions necessary, appropriate or advisable to carry out the purposes of and achieve the goals of this ordinance:

A. The Alaska Railroad will pay to the Municipality of Anchorage \$1.60 per square foot as the fair market value of the tidelands, in an annual payment of \$49,236.00.
