AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE AO 2001-80 BY CHANGING THE EFFECTIVE DATE ON THE PROHIBITION OF CERTAIN EXTERIOR SIGNS FOR LARGE RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS

WHEREAS, AO 2001-80 added a new section to Anchorage Municipal Code Title 21, which reads in part as follows:

**21.50.320 Public Hearing Site Plan Review – large retail establishment.**

M. *Exterior signs.* Pole signs, rotating signs, and flashing signs shall be prohibited.

WHEREAS, AO 2001-80, including the sign prohibition, was effective immediately upon its passage and approval on May 8, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the application of the prohibition on certain signs may unduly impact plans, contracts and commitments already made by local businesses; now therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

**Section 1.** The prohibition on certain types of signs in Anchorage Municipal Code subsection 21.50.320M. shall not be effective until June 1, 2002. AO 2001-80 is hereby amended consistent with the intent of this section.

**Section 2.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Assembly.
