Timeline for the evaluation period of the smokefree Anchorage ordinance.

The Smokefree Anchorage Coalition is requesting that the Assembly make a change in AO No. 2000-91 (S) for the evaluation of the ordinance to be completed and reported on within two years, rather than one year, after the initial implementation of this ordinance.

By extending the evaluation period from one to two years, the contracted researchers will have time to collect data related to the overall economic impact of the ordinance for a minimum of four quarters following the implementation of the ordinanca.

It has been recommended by internationally recognized researchers that a study of this type include economic impact data for at least four quarters following implementation of a clean indoor air ordinance in order to account for seasonal fluctuations in certain business sectors and year to year trends in the local economy.

Currently, under the one-year timeline, it has been estimated that only three months of economic data would be able to be attained, synthesized, analyzed, evaluated, and reported on by the Evaluation Advisory Committee. Due to the fact that Anchorage does not have sales tax data, the researchers contracted by the Municipality will need to collect other types of data that will reflect economic impact in more indirect ways. Considering this limiting condition, it is important to not further compromise the study with an inadequate period of data collection.

In addition, if the timeline is extended to two years, the contracted researchers will be able to rely on the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System data from the State Department of Health and Social Services as a source of information about the effect of the ordinance on reducing secondhand smoke exposure in Anchorage. By using these systematically collected data, the Municipality will save itself the expense of designing and carrying out a study to achieve similar results in a shorter period of time.
