THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2000-229, levying assessments under LUC Roll 2000-W-1, was acted on and approved at the Assembly meeting of September 12, 2000; and

Whereas, since the passage of AR 2000-229, new information indicates the water main serving item 31 of LUC Roll 2000-W-1 was contributed plant constructed under a water main extension agreement by a private developer in 1976, reducing the water assessment to be levied against item 31 to \$0.00; and

Whereas, the passage of this amendment will delete item 31 from LUC Roll 2000-W-1.

NOW THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

Section 1. Resolution No. 2000-229 is amended to delete Item thirty-one (31), described as Tr B, St. Benedicts Subdivision, Property ID 011-141-82, from LUC Roll 2000-W-1.

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY REQUESTING THAT THE MAYOR ESTABLISH A RECYCLING AND WASTE REDUCTION ADVISORY TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP A PLAN FOR A COMPREHENSIVE WASTE REDUCTION AND REUSE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, during last winter, disruptions in the recycling efforts within Anchorage resulted in an impressive public response; and

WHEREAS a Recycling Summit Steering Committee, comprised of representatives from the Assembly. the Administration, nonprofit organizations, businesses, and governmental agencies was formed to explore ways to focus on the advantages and epportunities of a strong recycling and waste reduction program; and

WHEREAS, the Recycling Summit Steering Committee held Anchorage's first Recycling Summit on March 29, 1997 to initiate steps to develop an economically viable and environmentally sound, integrated waste management program that brings new manufacturing opportunities and jobs to Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, the Summit was a successful event, hosting more than 325 participants throughout the Anchorage area and included a keynote speaker from the City of Seattle who shared information on Seattle's successful recycling program; and

WHEREAS, the Summit identified a number of ways to encourage entrepreneurial opportunities, thus reducing the amount currently being buried in the landfill, and remanufacturing those materials locally thereby creating jobs; and

WHEREAS, to determine the options available for enhanced recycling, reuse, and remanufacturing, a study is needed to determine the types of materials currently in the waste stream, the market potential of those materials, and the economics associated with various options for recycling and waste reduction; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the Summit, the Recycling Summit Committee unanimously approved a resolution requesting that the Municipality of Anchorage fund a waste stream study and establish a Task Force comprised of representatives from nonprofit organizations, businesses, appropriate agencies, and those citizens who want to see recycling and waste reduction expanded in the Anchorage area; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Task Force would be to develop a comprehensive plan to encourage recycling and waste reduction in the Anchorage area.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

 Section 1: That the Mayor is requested to establish a Recycling and Waste Reduction Advisory Task Force comprised of six members, three appointed by the Mayor and three appointed by the Assembly. All appointments shall be approved by the Assembly. The purpose of the Task Force is to develop a comprehensive plan to encourage recycling and waste reduction in the Anchorage area.

<u>Section 2:</u> That the Task Force will develop an RFP to hire a contractor to perform a feasibility study on waste content, recyclable materials, remanufacture opportunities, reuse options, cost/benefit determination, and market potential.

Section 3: That the goal for preparation and release of the RFP is August 1, 1997, and completion of a draft comprehensive waste management plan is 12 months after completion of the feasibility study.

Section 4: That this resolution is effective immediately upon passage and approval.

WHEREAS, Anchorage disposes an average of 6.2 pounds of solid waste per day per person compared with the national average of 4.0 pounds per day; and

WHEREAS, eighty per cent of materials going into the landfill is from non-residential sources; and

WHEREAS, there may be opportunities for reuse of a significant portion of materials currently being thrown away; and

WHEREAS, there is potential for entrepreneurial opportunities associated with the removal of certain segments of the solid waste stream materials, and

WHEREAS, there is significant interest by residents of Anchorage in developing a comprehensive, area-wide recycling and waste reduction program; and

WHEREAS, an entity to develop a plan for an integrated solid waste plan which includes an effective recycling component is needed; and

WHEREAS, in order to have the information necessary to determine the various potentials, a feasibility study on waste content, recyclable materials, and remanufacturing and reuse opportunities is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Recycling Summit Steering Committee respectfully requests that the Anchorage Assembly requests the Mayor to appoint a Recycling and Solid Waste Reduction Task Force, and requests that the Assembly approve the proposal for \$50,000 to fund a Waste Stream Identification and Market Potential Study.
