A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING AND HONORING
MILLIE I. WEBB, NATIONAL PRESIDENT, MOTHERS AGAINST DRUNK DRIVING (MADD).

WHEREAS, in 1971, Millie Webb became intimately involved with the drunk driving issue after a driver with a blood alcohol content (BAC) of .08 percent rear-ended the family vehicle carrying Millie, her husband, Roy, their four-and-a half-year-old daughter, Lori, and 19-month-old nephew, Mitchell Pewitt, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, seven months pregnant at the time, Millie suffered a broken neck and was burned on nearly 73 percent of her body, her husband, Roy, also suffered severe burns, her nephew, Mitchell, lived for six hours, and her daughter, Lori, suffered for two weeks before dying from burns covering 75 percent of her body; Kara, Millie's baby, was born premature and legally blind as a result of the crash; five years later, Roy and Millie were blessed with another child, Ashlea; and

WHEREAS, Millie was able to triumph over her tragedy, working diligently to prevent others from experiencing the pain that she faced due to one person's decision to drink and drive - since 1982, Millie has provided support and guidance to victims of drunk driving when she established the Williamson/Davidson County Chapter - the first MADD chapter in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, in 1991, Millie was elected to the MADD national board of directors, and throughout her tenure, she served as vice president of victim issues and on the board's public policy, executive, field issues and nominating committees; and

WHEREAS, in 2000, Millie's two-year term as national president of MADD kicked-off the organization's 20th anniversary, and her agenda as national president includes raising awareness for MADD's victim services, furthering initiatives to reach out to diverse communities, and establishing programs to reduce youth alcohol use.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:

That the Assembly recognizes and honors

Millie I. Webb
National President, MADD

for her tireless work with MADD, especially in establishing a national .08 BAC standard for drunk driving, which was signed into law by President Clinton on October 23, 2000, and in working for greater enforcement and penalties for repeat and high-risk drunk driving offenders.
