A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY APPROPRIATING FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM AREAWIDE GENERAL FUND (101) BALANCE TO NONDEPARTMENTAL TO BE USED AS A GRANT TO THE AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF ALASKA FOR THE 2001 JUNETEENTH CELEBRATION

WHEREAS, Juneteenth celebrates the freedom of more than 250,000 slaves at the close of the Civil War; and

WHEREAS, this celebration takes its name from June 19, 1865, the day the Federal troops arrived in Galveston to enforce the Emancipation Proclamation which had taken effect on January 1, 1863; and

WHEREAS, the holiday is based on events that occurred mainly in Texas, but is now celebrated throughout the Nation; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth Celebration provides Anchorage's diverse community an opportunity to enhance cultural awareness; and

WHEREAS, this year's Celebration will take place between June 15-17, 2001 and will provide 50 booths filled with food, crafts, and information and entertainment from variety of musicians, speakers, and dancers, and children will be able to participate in the Kids' Game portion of the Celebration; and

WHEREAS, this year's budget for the event is \$55,000, and the host of the event has requested that the Municipality assist with expenses for this worthwhile community event.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves

<u>Section 1:</u> That the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) is appropriated from Areawide General Fund (101) Balance to Nondepartmental to be used as a grant to the African American Historical Society of Alaska to assist with funding the 2001 Juneteenth Celebration.

<u>Section 2:</u> That, if after a final accounting has been done, the coordinators of the 2001 Juneteenth Celebration are able to demonstrate a profit, the Municipality shall be reimbursed, to the fullest extent possible, for this grant.

Section 3: That this resolution is effective immediately upon passage and approval.

- Sec. 44.12.090. Juneteenth Day. Juneteenth Day is established on the third Saturday in June each year to commemorate the abolition of slavery throughout the United States and its territories in 1865. The governor shall issue a proclamation to commemorate the day. On Juneteenth Day, citizens of the state are urged to reflect on 7 the suffering endured by early African-Americans and to appreciate the unique freedom and equality enjoyed by all state citizens today.

Juneteenth is a celebration of the freedom of more than 250,000 slaves at the close of the Civil War. This event will occur, in union, across the nation because it is a celebration that frees the African American Community from the bonds of modern day. It is a state holiday in Texas and, most recently, Senate Bill No. 100, "Establishing the third Saturday of each June as Juneteenth Day" was signed by the Governor of Alaska (See attached).

Anchorage has continued to participate in this worthwhile community event, and plans are underway to commemorate the 2001 Juneteenth Celebration by continuing to provide Anchorage's diverse community with an opportunity to enhance cultural awareness. The budget for this year's event is \$55,000 and, the host for this event, the African American Historical Society of Alaska, is requesting financial assistance from the Municipality.
