A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$50,000 FROM AREAWIDE GENERAL FUND BALANCE 0101 TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW TO FUND LEGAL RESEARCH, INVESTIGATION, REPRESENTATION AND ACTION TO DEFEND AND ADVANCE ASSEMBLY AND MAYORAL RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE STATE'S DECENNIAL REAPPORTIONMENT PLAN.

WHEREAS, on April 10, 2001 the Anchorage Assembly, by unanimous vote of its nine members present, recommended to the Alaska Redistricting Board that:

1. "the Government Hill neighborhood be rejoined with Downtown Anchorage for purposes of representation in the Alaska Legislature"; and

2. "Legislative Districts which include portions of the Municipality should extend no further south than Whittier and Hope and, instead, be directed toward the Point McKenzie area and/or north along the Glenn/Parks Highways."; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Member Tremaine representing south Anchorage opposed sharing an election district with Valdez; and

WHEREAS, the State Redistricting Board has combined south Anchorage with Valdez contrary to the specific recommendation of the Assembly and Assembly Member Tremaine representing south Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, combining south Anchorage with the City of Valdez raises a serious and substantial issue that such house district violates the Alaska constitutional mandate that election districts be contiguous, compact and an integrated socio-economic area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Valdez City Council unanimously opposes combining the City of Valdez with the south Anchorage House District and, on June 18, 2001 authorized litigation protesting the final State Redistricting Plan; and

WHEREAS, the State Redistricting Board has also separated Government Hill from downtown Anchorage contrary to the Assembly's recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the State Redistricting Board has combined the Fort Richardson and Elmendorff Military bases with Government Hill separate from Downtown Anchorage and adversely affecting the voting rights of resident military personnel; and
