A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZING AND HONORING JOHN L. ALEXANDER FOR HIS 33 YEARS OF PUBLIC SERVICE WITHIN ANCHORAGE

WHEREAS, John L. Alexander began his public service career with the State of Alaska in 1968 as a Employment Interviewer and continued to move up the ladder within the Department of Labor becoming the first African-American to hold a cabinet post after being appointed as the Commissioner of Labor under Governor Egan; and

WHEREAS, after six years with the State of Alaska, he transferred to private industry accepting the position of Equal Employment Opportunity, Safety, and Labor Relations Officer for Modern Construction, Inc. where he wrote and implemented Modern's Affirmative Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, John's labor relations experience and expertise led him to directly represent union employees when he served as the Business Representative for IBEW between October 1976 and November 1978 and later becoming the Executive Director of the Alaska Federation of Teachers in 1979; and

WHEREAS, John's enduring community involvement and familiarity with the many aspects of employee relations won him the position of Director of Equal Employment Opportunity in the Office of the Federal Inspector of the Alaska Natural Gas Transportation System in Washington, D.C. where he negotiated with sponsor companies regarding hiring and contracting goals while reassuring that the Federal Register requirements were adequately satisfied; and

WHEREAS, the next five years of John's public service were spent as the Labor Relations Manager within the Municipality of Anchorage's Department of Employee Relations where he was responsible for negotiations and administration of six labor agreements involving thirteen labor unions; and

WHEREAS, in July 1988, John returned to the State of Alaska and worked in the Department of Labor as an Employment Preference Supervisor enforcing the State's Employment Preference or Resident Hire Act; and

WHEREAS, the last journey of John's contribution within the Anchorage workforce began in 1991 when he accepted employment with the Anchorage School District and maintained the positions of Director of Contract Administration, Executive Director of Labor Relations, Staff Assistant for Minority Affairs, Acting Director of Equal Employment Opportunity and, ultimately, Director of Equal Employment Opportunity from June 1995 to present; and

WHEREAS, on June 29, 2001, John L. Alexander retired after 33 years of public service and commitment to the citizens of Anchorage.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves that:

JOHN L. ALEXANDER

is recognized and honored for his 33 years of public service within Anchorage.
