A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY CONDEMNING THE TERRORIST
ATTACK ON THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, the United States of America, without warning, was
brutally attacked by terrorists; and

WHEREAS, this premeditated act included hijacking four domestic airliners and crashing two
of them into the towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, a third into the Pentagon outside
Washington, D.C., and a fourth in a Pennsylvania field; and

WHEREAS, thousands of innocent people - mostly Americans - were killed and injured as a
result of these attacks, including the passengers and crew of the four airliners, visitors and workers
in the World Trade Center and in the Pentagon, rescue workers, and bystanders; and

WHEREAS, these evil and cowardly acts were by far the deadliest terrorist attacks ever
undertaken against the United States and, by targeting symbols of American strength and success,
clearly were intended to intimidate our nation and weaken its resolve; and

WHEREAS, though these horrific events have affected all Americans and people throughout
the World, it is important that we carry on with the regular activities of our lives and not let terrorism
weaken the spirit of the American people, illustrating to these cowards that they have truly failed as
the people of the United States and their communities continue to stand united and proud.


NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:

Section 1: That the Assembly condemns attacks of terrorism on the United States and
supports the President as he works with Congress, his national security team, and the rest of the
World to locate the perpetrators and bring them to justice.


Section 2: That the Assembly supports and encourages our community to continue assisting

Giuliani, Mayor of New York City.
