## ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO NO. 2002-16

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ANCHORAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S DISPOSAL BY DEMOLITION OF THE CURRENT DENALI ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUILDING

WHEREAS, Anchorage Municipal Code 25.30.020 provides that the municipality may dispose of municipal land or any interest therein only by ordinance.

WHEREAS, in April 2000 the voters approved funding for the replacement of Denali Elementary School.

WHEREAS, the School Board approved Kumin Associates, Inc. as the design firm for the project on August 14, 2000 (ASD Memorandum #27 2000-2001).

WHEREAS, the replacement school is currently in the final phase of design and is anticipated to start construction in the summer of 2002 and to be completed August 2003.

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage Assembly approved Kumin Associates, Inc. the design firm of record on August 15, 2000 (AR-2000-239).

WHEREAS, the School Board approved the Schematic Design for the Denali Elementary Replacement School on February 12, 2001 (ASD Memorandum #196 2000-2001).

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage approved the preliminary design for the Denali Elementary Replacement School on January 9, 2001 (AR-2001-1).

WHEREAS, the footprint of the new school building overlaps the existing Denali Elementary School building.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to demolish the current Denali Elementary School Building in order to construct the Denali Elementary School Replacement.

NOW THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly ordains:
