Subject: AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A BALLOT PROPOSITION FOR AN ANCHORAGE PARKS AND RECREATION SERVICE AREA BOND (\$8,930,000)

The attached ordinance is being submitted to acquire approval to place a bond proposition on the ballot at the April 2, 2002 election to pay the costs of parks and recreation and related capital improvements in the Anchorage Parks and Recreation Service Area. This ordinance represents a \$600,000 increase over the amount in AO 2002-27 so that additional, currently unidentified, projects can be funded if the bond is approved.

Based on the estimated 2002 assessed valuation, the annual increase in the Municipal Tax Cap to pay for annual operations and maintenance will be \$0.89 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation. The annual increase in taxes to retire the proposed bond indebtedness is estimated at \$5.22 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation.
