Section 3. An election is to be held on April 2, 2002, in and for the Municipality of 3 Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the 4 gualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive 5 a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting, both in the Metropolitan Anchorage 6 7 Police Service Area and areawide, on the guestion to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form: 8 **PROPOSITION NO** 9 ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA PUBLIC SAFETY 10 (POLICE PROTECTION) AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS 11 Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$3,900,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds to pay costs of relocating the 12 current impound lot and demolition of public safety structures and related police protection capital improvements within the 13 Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area? 14 The annual increase in taxes on \$100,000 of assessed real and personal property value (based on the estimated 2002, 15 assessed valuation in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area) necessary to retire the proposed debt is approxi-16 mately \$2.01. 17 The debt shall be paid from real and personal property taxes levied and collected in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police 18 Service Area. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the bonds. 19 (No. AO 2002-20 Section 4.
