### ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO NO. 2002-123

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 4, BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS, BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 4.60.240, AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT ADVISORY COMMISSION

#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1:</u> That AMC Section 4.60 is amended by enacting a new Section 4.60.240. Americans with Disabilities Act Advisory Commission, to read as follows:

### 4.60.240 Americans With Disabilities Act Advisory Commission.

There is established an Americans with Disabilities Act Advisory Commission consisting of seven members with three members from active disability organizations and four members within the community. The Director of the Department of Health and Human Services or a designee selected by the Mayor will act as the Executive Secretary for the Commission.

#### The Commission shall:

- A. Review the Americans with Disabilities Act in order to maintain a clear and comprehensive understanding of Federal legislation addressing all forms of discrimination against individuals on the basis of disability.
- B. Make recommendations to the Mayor and Assembly for the adoption, change or repeal of Municipal laws, rules, regulations, restrictions or other matters affecting individuals with disabilities.
- C. Act in an advisory capacity to the Mayor and the Assembly in matters of policy concerning Anchorage's implementation of the Americans With Disabilities Act.
- D. Report at least quarterly to the Mayor and the Assembly on individuals with disabilities issues and progress in relevant areas such as employment and public and private accommodations.
- E. Identify Municipal facilities and employment procedures that require modifications and advise the Mayor and Assembly of those issues.

- F. Undertake efforts to open and maintain channels of communications with Anchorage's disabled community and to periodically hold hearings on matters of importance to that community, the Anchorage community as a whole, and the municipal government.
- G. Carry out educational and public relations programs designed to create public awareness.
- H. Perform such other powers and duties as the Assembly may refer from time to time.

Section 2: That this ordinance is effective upon passage and approval.

#### **PUBLIC SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:**

Although the Anchorage Municipal Code provides for compensation to advisory boards or commissions in the amount of \$20 per member for each meeting attended, the estimated public sector economic effects will be substantially lower than \$30,000. For example, if one meeting per month was held, the annual compensation would be based on the seven member board in addition to some staff time spent attending meetings, providing minutes of meetings, and possible costs for a meal depending on the time of day the meetings are held.

#### **PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMIC EFFECTS:**

There are no substantial, if any, private sector economic effects anticipated.

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS, BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 4.60.240,

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT ADVISORY COMMISSION

The Americans With Disabilities Act Advisory Commission was established in February, 1992 with an ultimate goal of maintaining channels of communications with Anchorage's disabled community. The Anchorage Municipal Code Section 4.05.150 states that newly created boards and commissions "shall have a life not to exceed three years." It also states that prior to the termination, continuation, or re-establishment of the board or commission, a public hearing "shall be held and the board or commission shall demonstrate the need for its continuation." The Commission was re-established in 1995 and 1998, but in December 2000, the recommended sunset occurred.

Since the Commission is no longer in existence, a new section of the Code must be established to re-enact the Americans With Disabilities Act Advisory Commission. AO 2002-123, if approved, will bring back a commission that we believe serves a pertinent public purpose and is needed within our diverse community.
