1 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 11.50.030A. TO
2 INCREASE THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS ON THE PORT COMMISSION FROM SEVEN TO
3 NINE, AND AUTHORIZING UP TO TWO MEMBERS TO BE ALASKAN CITIZENS WHO
4 ARE NOT RESIDENTS OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

7 THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

9 Section 1. Anchorage Municipal Code section 11.50.030A. is amended as follows:

11 11.50.030 Port Commission.

13 A. Membership.

15 1. The port commission shall consist of nine [SEVEN] members appointed by
16 the mayor and confirmed by the assembly; and



18 2. Notwithstanding the qualifications of board and commission members set out
19 in subsections 4.05.035A. and B., up to two members of the port commission
20 may be Alaskan citizens who are not residents of the municipality. ~~Non-~~
21 ~~resident members may not vote and may only serve as ex-officio.~~

23 Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by
24 the Assembly. This ordinance shall be reviewed one year after the effective date.

3 SUBJECT: An Amendment to Anchorage Municipal Code Section 11.50.030A. Increasing the
4 Number of Port Commission Members from Seven (7) to Nine (9) and Authorizing Up
5 to Two (2) Commission Members Who Are Not Residents of the Municipality of
6 Anchorage.

8 The Port of Anchorage is Alaska's Regional Port, serving 80% of the State's population and
9 contributing an estimated \$725 million annually to Alaska's economy. Approximately 90% of the
10 consumer goods destined for Alaska's Railbelt enter the State over the Port of Anchorage's pier.
11

12 As a major economic factor and one of the strongest links in the Alaska transportation chain, the Port
13 has direct impact on various sections of the population and sectors of the economy within Anchorage
14 and throughout Alaska. It is important that the Port Commission's membership reflect those various
15 areas of the population and segments of the economy. To that end, the submitted Assembly
16 Ordinance will increase the membership of the Anchorage Port Commission from seven (7)
17 members to nine (9) members and provide that up to two (2) Commission members may be Alaskan
18 citizens who are not residents of the Municipality of Anchorage.

20 The Administration recommends approval of the Assembly Ordinance.
