A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY SUPPORTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING STEERING COMMITTEE.

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WHEREAS, coordinating regional transportation planning and programming in Southcentral Alaska, particularly in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region, will result in the selection of projects that most benefit the population and economy of the region; and

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WHEREAS, the Senate Transportation Committee shares the belief that transportation planning should be better coordinated in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region; and

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WHEREAS, Chugiak-Eagle River Chamber of Commerce began an effort that identified a need to coordinate regional transportation planning between Anchorage and the Mat-Su Borough; and

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WHEREAS, Anchorage and Mat-Su Borough Assemblies support better coordination of regional transportation planning and programming; and

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WHEREAS, the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has commissioned a study to develop a structure to support coordinated and cooperative regional transportation in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region, and a Steering Committee composed of regional transportation policymakers could assist the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities in its efforts; and

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WHEREAS, on January 22, 2002, the Mat-Su Borough Assembly approved a resolution nearly identical to this resolution (see attached).

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NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

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Section 1: That the Assembly supports the establishment of a Regional Transportation Steering Committee to assist the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities in its efforts to develop a structure for coordinated and cooperative regional transportation planning in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region.

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Section 2: That the Assembly recommends that the Steering Committee be composed of twelve members consisting of:

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Committee: A representative of the Alaska Railroad; and

51 52 53 A representative of the Alaska State Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

SUMMARY STATEMENT: The Anchorage/Mat-Su region serves as Alaska's primary transportation hub and is where Alaska's major marine port, busiest international airport and where over half of the state's road system is located. Currently each local government undertakes its own transportation planning and programming even for projects of regional significance. The lack of coordination on transportation planning and programming matters results in duplication of effort, a lack of integration in planning efforts and a dilution of efforts to obtain scarce financial resources.

Transportation planning and programming within the region could bring large benefits to the region, the most important being, identification and completion of projects that benefit the population and economy of the entire region. The need to do a better job at regional transportation planning and programming is shared by various parties, including the Chugiak/Eagle River and Wasilla Chamber of Commerce, the Senate Transportation Committee,

the Municipality of Anchorage and the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, the Alaska Railroad and the State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities. To improve upon the current transportation planning efforts in the region, the State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities has commissioned a study to develop a structure to support coordinated and cooperative regional transportation in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region. This study is to be completed in the winter of 2002. A Steering Committee composed of regional transportation policy makers could assist the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities in its efforts to develop a structure for coordinated and cooperative regional transportation planning in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region. It is important that the major transportation interests of the region are involved in formulating the method for improving Therefore it is regional transportation planning and programming. recommended that the Steering Committee be comprised of members from the House and Senate Transportation Committees, members of the Mat-Su Borough and Municipality of Anchorage Liaison Committee members and representatives of the Alaska Railroad, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities.

RECOMMENDATION OF ADMINISTRATION: Establishment of a Steering Committee to assist the Department of Transportation's consultant in developing a structure to coordinate regional transportation planning and programming.
