A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY HONORING AND REMEMBERING FRED CHIEI, JR.

WHEREAS, Fred Chiei, Jr. arrived in Anchorage with his wife Marjorie in 1960 relocating from New Jersey and quickly moving into the City's civic and social atmosphere serving as President of the Anchorage Chamber of Commerce, as a Director of the Anchorage Symphony Association, and as National Director of the U.S. Navy League; and

WHEREAS, although he was trained as an engineer, he established a career in the communications field holding an executive position with RCA Alascom serving as Project Manager for the White Alice Communications System; and

WHEREAS, Fred's government service included the United States Navy where he, ultimately, served as Lieutenant Commander in World War II, and as Deputy Regional Administrator for the Federal Energy Administration; and

WHEREAS, Fred was an active member of the Charter Commission which wrote the Home Rule Charter and encouraged the public to support the Unification Charter adopted by referendum on September 9, 1975 with an effective date of September 16, 1975; and

WHEREAS, after Unification, Fred was elected to the Anchorage Assembly in 1975 and served until 1983 remaining attentive to his voting constituency doing what he felt would benefit both the public administration and, the newly created, unified city; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure on the Assembly, he was an asset to his colleagues in many ways, and he worked diligently to keep the meetings on track by assisting in getting "the business at-hand" accomplished in a timely and efficient manner; and

WHEREAS, Fred was often characterized as a "wit with a bite," a conservative who often surprised people with his votes, and a man who enjoyed and appreciated his public presence while serving in the capacity of an elected official.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves that:

is honored and remembered for his commitment, dedication, and service within the Municipality of Anchorage.
