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A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY NAMING MUNICIPAL LIGHT AND POWER PLANT 1 IN HONOR OF THE LATE HANK NIKKELS, MANAGER OF POWER PRODUCTION AT MUNICIPAL LIGHT AND POWER (ML&P) FOR TWENTY-FIVE YEARS.

WHEREAS, AMC 3.97 establishes a means of recognizing and honoring persons who have substantially contributed to the Municipality of Anchorage by naming municipalowned buildings, other fixed facilities, and public places after such persons; and

WHEREAS, under AMC 3.97, this naming action may be initiated by a formal request of the Assembly to the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, Hank Nikkels played a critical part in the development of ML&P from April 1977 until his death in February 2002; and

WHEREAS, Hank Nikkels was instrumental in implementing the National Institute Licensed Power Engineers program in the state of Alaska and was the first in the nation to apply a Dry Low NOx combustions system to a Frame-7 turbine; and

WHEREAS, Hank Nikkels streamlined the power production process at ML&P and initiated many new and innovative ideas that benefited the Utility and the Municipality of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, Hank Nikkels wrote a study, combined with others, which eventually led to the development and implementation of the Woodward Governor Control system which is currently used by ML&P; and

WHEREAS, under Hank Nikkels's direction, ML&P in conjunction with the Woodward Governor Company, was an innovator in applying a non-OEM control system to gas turbines at both Plant 1 and the George M. Sullivan Plant 2, making ML&P one of the first, if not the first, utility to implement this type of system; and
