A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY REQUIRING ANCHORAGE WATER AND WASTEWATER UTILITY TO ENGAGE THE SERVICES OF A PROFESSIONAL CONSULTANT TO REVIEW THE APPROPRIATENESS OF THE WATER USAGE TARIFF FEES AND HYDRANT MAINTENANCE COSTS CHARGED TO THE ANCHORAGE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND TO REPORT TO THE ASSEMBLY.

WHEREAS, municipal fire protection service should provide good quality service at a reasonable price to the citizens of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU) provides fire hydrant maintenance services which are allocated to the Anchorage Fire Department; and water usage tariff fees

WHEREAS, AWWU is in the process of preparing a Cost of Service Study (COSS) for submission to the Regulatory Commission of Alaska (RCA); and

WHEREAS, an independent review of the Cost of Service Study would help ensure that the costs of fire hydrant maintenance services are reasonably assigned and allocated, and that the cost of fire hydrant maintenance service is reasonable and water usage tariff fees

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

Section 1. That AWWU shall fully document its current Cost of Service Study, including:

the cost assignment and cost allocation methodologies considered, and either adopted or rejected, and the supporting rationale;

the cost assignment and cost allocation assumptions, including time and motion studies, capacity utilization studies, and other cost studies conducted but not used, and the rationale for which studies were adopted or rejected;

(3) comparison of fire hydrant maintenance costs to benchmark costs from other comparable municipalities.

Section 2. Under the supervision of the Assembly, an independent rate and regulatory policy consultant shall be engaged, at a cost not to exceed \$30,000, to conduct an independent review of the fire hydrant costs identified in the AWWU Cost of Service Study and provide a written report and presentation to the Assembly and water usage tariff fees

The scope of this review was to determine the extent to which the study adhered to sound cost-of-service and rate design principles. 10 11 12 By 1994 the AFD and AWWU had jointly agreed to the majority of the issues raised by the 13 Price Waterhouse report. The resulting new 1995 tariffed rate to AFD of \$2,475,000 had been reduced by approximately \$660,000 from the original proposed rate. The 1995 tariffed rate is still in effect. 15 16 The 1991 Price Waterhouse report contained two discussion points that both AFD and AWWU 17 18 believed at the time were not relevant to the Cost of Service Study. Administration wishes to explore every option for the methodology associated with fire protection fee, and cost recovery methods.
