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A RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING ANNUAL ENTITLEMENT GRANTS FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND ANTICIPATED PROGRAM INCOME IN THE AMOUNTS OF TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY-THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,283,000) OF ENTITLEMENT AND ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$180,000) OF ANTICIPATED PROGRAM INCOME FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG), ONE MILLION SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,071,000) OF ENTITLEMENT FOR THE HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (HOME), AND EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$80,000) OF ENTITLEMENT FOR EMERGENCY SHELTER GRANTS (ESG), AND APPROPRIATING SAID FUNDS TO THE FEDERAL

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WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage has submitted its annual application and 2002 Action Plan of the 2000-2002 Consolidated Housing and Community Development Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, outlining the program of activities to be undertaken with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Home Investment Partnership (HOME) Program, and Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funds; and

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WHEREAS, throughout the development of said application and 2002 Action Plan, the Municipality of Anchorage actively sought participation of residents and representatives of lower income Anchorage neighborhoods, including community councils, and

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WHEREAS, public testimony on said application and 2002 Action Plan was heard before the Housing & Neighborhood Development Commission, and

28 29 30 WHEREAS, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly adopted the 2002 Action Plan on May 14, 2002.

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NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly Resolves:

Section 1. That the subject grants from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the PY2002 allocation of CDBG funds, in the amount of two million two hundred eighty-three thousand dollars (\$2,283,000) of entitlement and one hundred and eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000) of anticipated program income, the PY2002 allocation of HOME funds, in the amount of one million seventy-one thousand dollars (\$1,071,000), and PY2002 allocation of ESG in the amount of eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000), are hereby appropriated, with final approval received from HUD on August 30, 2002, to the Federal Categorical Grant Fund (241) for use in activities under the CDBG, HOME and ESG programs.

Section 2. That the allocation of said grant funds will be based on the activities outlined in the attached Assembly Memorandum, and in the 2002 Action Plan of the 2000-2002 Consolidated Housing and Community Development Plan, which incorporates Anchorage's Continuum of Care. Accounting information is outlined in the attached Assembly Memorandum, Attachment A.

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Section 3. That this resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Anchorage Assembly.

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5 The Community Development Division, Planning Department, requests approval of the attached 6 resolution to appropriate Housing and Urban Development Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership Grant (HOME), and Emergency Shelter Grant 7 (ESG) entitlement funds, in accordance with the Consolidated Housing and Community 8 9 Development 2002 Action Plan. The 2002 Action Plan is the annual update to the 2000-2002 Consolidated Housing and Community Development Plan and constitutes the Municipality's 10 application for HUD entitlement PY02 CDBG, HOME and ESG funds. The 2002 Action Plan 11 12 was developed in accordance with HUD and Municipal regulations, adopted by the Assembly on May 14, 2002 submitted to HUD by May 15, 2002 and approved by HUD on August 9, 2002. 13

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CDBG and HOME grants are managed by the Planning Department, Community Development Division. ESG is managed by the Department of Health and Human Services.

Attachment B PY02 SUMMARY OF NEW PROPOSED CAPITAL PROJECTS

- 1. AWAIC, Transitional Housing and Expansion Report \$800,000 This project is in its second funding year, and will build an addition to the current site owned by AWAIC at 100 West 13th Avenue. This will assist in creating secure, congregate 10-bed transition housing for women who are domestic violence victims. The project will also provide additional space for support services for those residents, support services for other domestic violence victims in transition but not a current resident on AWAIC property, and outreach and prevention education.
- 2. Alcohol and Substance Abuse Permanent Supportive Housing \$100,975 To provide funding that will address the extent of the problem and the predevelopment of a facility that would ultimately provide safe service-support for homeless people with alcohol addiction.







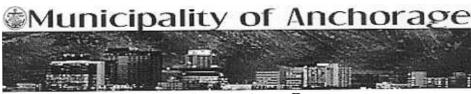
