AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.50.050 KEG OR CONTAINER REGISTRATION

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: Anchorage Municipal Code Section 10.50.050 is amended as follows:

10.50.050 Keg or Container Registration.

- A. Obligations of seller. Any person who sells, leases, or offers for sale or lease, kegs or other containers holding <u>seven</u> [FOUR] gallons or more of an alcoholic beverage to consumers who are not licensed under AS 04.11 shall, prior to surrendering physical possession of the keg or other container:
 - 1. Require the purchaser of the alcoholic beverage to sign a registration [DECLARATION AND RECEIPT] for the keg or other container on an [A] approved form [BY THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE CHIEF OF POLICE AND] which meets the requirements set forth under subsection (C) of this section:
 - 2. Require the purchaser to provide identification pursuant to AS 04.21.050;
 - Affix an approved temporary tag with a unique identifier [A PROPERLY COMPLETED AND SIGNED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM, WHICH MAY ALSO SERVE AS THE PURCHASER'S RECEIPT,] to all containers of <u>seven</u> [FOUR] gallons or more of an alcoholic beverage prior to surrendering possession or control thereof to a consumer;
 - 4. Retain a copy of the completed and signed registration <u>form</u> [DECLARATION AND RECEIPT], which shall be retained on the licensed premises for a period of one year and shall be available for inspection and copying by any peace officer or Alcohol Beverage Control Board investigator or agent;
 - 5. [WITHIN TWO DAYS OF THE PURCHASE, SEND ONE COPY OF THE COMPLETED AND SIGNED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT TO THE ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND]

- B. Obligations of purchaser. Any person who purchases or leases kegs or other containers holding **seven** [FOUR] gallons or more of an alcoholic beverage shall:
 - 1. Complete and sign a registration [DECLARATION AND RECEIPT] form for the keg or other container on a form provided by the seller pursuant to subsection (A)(1) of this section;
 - 2. Provide identification pursuant to AS 04.21.050;
 - 3. Be of legal age to purchase, possess, or use alcoholic beverages;
 - 4. Not allow any person under the age of 21 to consume the beverage except as provided by AS 04.16.051;
 - 5. Not remove, obliterate, or allow to be removed or obliterated, the <u>temporary tag</u> [COPY OF THE COMPLETED AND SIGNED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM] attached to the keg or container as required under subsection (A) [(C)]of this section;
 - 6. [RETURN THE KEG OR OTHER CONTAINER TO THE PLACE OF PURCHASE NO LATER THAN THE DATE INDICATED ON THE CONTAINER IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION; AND]
 - 7. [NOT MOVE, KEEP, OR STORE THE KEG OR ITS CONTENTS, EXCEPT FOR TRANSPORTING TO AND FROM THE DISTRIBUTOR, AT ANY PLACE OTHER THAN THAT PARTICULAR ADDRESS OR ADDRESSES DECLARED ON THE COMPLETED AND SIGNED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM.]
- C. Identification of containers.
 - A keg registration [DECLARATION AND RECEIPT] form provided by licensees and approved by the Anchorage Police Department shall be properly completed by the licensee for sales and leases of kegs or other containers holding <u>seven</u> [FOUR] or more gallons of an alcoholic beverage for offpremises consumption, and shall contain:

- a. The name [AND ADDRESS] of the seller;
- b. The name [AND ADDRESS] of the purchaser;
- c. The type and **identifying** [SERIAL] number of the identification presented by the purchaser pursuant to AS 04.21.050;
- d. A sworn statement, signed by the purchaser under penalty of perjury, stating that the purchaser is 21 years of age or older; will not allow persons under 21 years of age to consume the alcoholic beverages purchased except as provided by AS 04.16.051, will not remove or obliterate or allow the removal or obliteration of the temporary registration tag [DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM] affixed to the keg or other container, and will return the keg within the time constraints set by the seller [TO THE SELLER NO LATER THAN 48 HOURS AFTER THE CONSUMPTION DATE OR DATES LISTED ON THE COMPLETED AND SIGNED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM];
- e. The <u>return date specified by the seller</u> [PARTICULAR ADDRESS OR ADDRESSES WHERE THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WILL BE CONSUMED, AND THE DATE OR DATES ON WHICH IT WILL BE CONSUMED]; and
- f. The unique identifier of the temporary tag attached to the keg or container as required under subsection (A) of this section [A WARNING THAT IT IS ILLEGAL TO OBSCURE OR REMOVE THE COMPLETED AND SIGNED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM AND THAT POSSESSION OF A KEG OR OTHER CONTAINER WHICH IS CAPABLE OF HOLDING FOUR OR MORE GALLONS OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE, OTHER THAN ON THE SELLER'S PREMISES, WITHOUT A PROPERLY COMPLETED REGISTRATION DECLARATION AND RECEIPT FORM AFFIXED THEREON SHALL BE A VIOLATION OF THIS CHAPTER].

D. Offenses.

- It is unlawful for any package store licensee, agent, or employee to sell or offer for sale kegs or other containers containing <u>seven</u> [FOUR] gallons or more of alcoholic beverages to consumers who are not licensed under AS 04.11, if the kegs or containers are not identified in compliance with this Section [CHAPTER].
- 2. It is unlawful for any person who is not licensed under AS 04.11, to possess, or be in control of a keg or other container containing <u>seven</u> [FOUR] gallons or

more of alcoholic beverages which is not identified in compliance with this <u>Section or to alter or remove the temporary tag affixed by the seller pursuant to subsection (A)(1) of this section [CHAPTER].</u>

E. Penalties. Except as provided in AS 04.16.051, a person who violates any provision of <u>Section 10.50.050</u> [THIS CHAPTER] shall be <u>subject to a civil</u> <u>penalty</u> [GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A FINE] of not less than \$75.00 and not more than \$300.00 for each offense as follows:



Subject: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION

10.50.050, KEG OR CONTAINER REGISTRATION

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend the requirements of AMC Section 10.50.050 to address 14 implementation concerns expressed by the Great Northern Brewer's Club, representatives of the micro brewery industry, Municipal Legal Department staff, retailers, and law enforcement.

The following concerns and suggestions expressed at the July 11, 2003 worksession have been addressed in this revision:

- Reflect standard retail keg/container size of seven gallons.
- Change the language to require "approved temporary tag" instead of "declaration registration and receipt form."
- Delete the APD notification requirement.
- Use the sample Keg Register form supplied by Brown Jug, Inc. as a guideline for the retail registration form requirement.
- Add a provision to address kegs/containers returned with altered or removed registration
- Delete the requirement to return kegs/containers within 48 hours.
- Change the effective date to October 1, 2003 to allow time for additional worksessions and public hearing to address changes.
- Correct penalty references per communication from Municipal Legal Department staff.

Revising the new section to reflect concerns of the business community and the Municipality will ensure successful and effective implementation.

Approval of this ordinance is recommended.
