## ANCHORAGE. ALASKA AO NO. 2003-135 as Amended

AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 9, VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, CHAPTER 9.36. MISCELLANEOUS RULES, BY ADDING SECTIONS 9.36.015 AND 9.36.020 EXEMPTING CERTAIN UNATTENDED VEHICLES AND LIMITING IDLING TIME.

#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

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Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 9.36 is hereby amended by adding Section 1. sections 9.36.015 and 9.36.020 to read as follows: 10]

#### Duties of driver on leaving vehicle unattended. 9.36.010

No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle may permit it to stand upon a public street unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key from the ignition, effectively setting the brake thereon and, when standing upon any grade, turning the front wheels to the curb or side of the highway. If a vehicle is left running in a public or private parking lot, the hand brake shall be left on and any automatic transmission shall be placed in the "park" mode.

#### Exemption of certain vehicles. 9.36.015

- The provisions of section 9.36.010 pertaining to a person driving or in charge of a <u>A.</u> motor vehicle standing upon a public street unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, and removing the key from the ignition do not apply to a vehicle equipped with a remote ignition start device, which is capable of starting a vehicle's ignition without the vehicle's ignition key, if:
  - The vehicle is locked and equipped with an anti-theft feature which prevents <u>1.</u> the vehicle from being driven without the ignition key being properly inserted; and
  - The owner of the vehicle displays on the vehicle a decal or sticker indicating the presence of such a remote ignition start device.
- The provisions of section 9.36.010 regulating unattended vehicles shall not apply to **B**. vehicles operated by the police or fire department, any public or private ambulance, any public utility vehicle, or any municipal vehicle providing scheduled public

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transportation.

The provisions of section 9.36.010 regulating unattended vehicles shall not apply to any vehicle of a city department or public utility while necessarily in use for construction or repair work, or any authorized police vehicle when on official police business other than an emergency nature.

## Limitation on Idling Time.

No person exempted under the provisions of 9.36.015A. shall allow an unattended vehicle motor vehicle to idle for more than 20 minutes.

This ordinance shall become effective upon passage and approval. Section 2.

Subject: AO 2003–135 — Leaving Vehicles Unattended and Idling Time.

AMC 9.36.010 prohibits the operation of unattended motor vehicles. The ordinance was adopted in 1978, and new technology has been developed in the form of remote starters since that time. This proposed ordinance adopts a new section exempting certain vehicles, such as those equipped with remote ignition start devices and which contain certain features, such as the capability to start the vehicle without the vehicle's ignition key, and an anti-theft feature. In addition, the owner of the vehicle must have a decal or sticker indicating the presence of a remote ignition start device. DHHS Air Quality Division has recommended a 20 minute idling time, and the Anchorage Police Department, Fire Department, Prosecutor's Office, and Traffic and Public Transit Departments have been provided with a copy of the ordinance for review and comment. Certain vehicles engaged in emergency activities and those instrumental to various governmental operations, such as police and fire vehicles, public or private ambulances, vehicles of city departments and public utilities, and scheduled public transportation will be exempt.
