A Resolution Adopting Recommendations to be forwarded to the AMATS Policy Committee regarding the adoption of the FFY 2004 - 2006 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The Municipal Assembly is asked to adopt recommendations regarding the adoption of the 2004-06 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and forward that resolution to the Anchorage Metropolitan Area Transportation Solutions (AMATS) Policy Committee. In accordance with AO 97-139(S), the Municipal Assembly shall review and by resolution adopt recommendations on the TIP

within 30 days after the TIP is introduced for action, unless the AMATS Policy Committee and

Assembly otherwise agree to a longer period of time.

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The AMATS Policy Committee adopted the 2001-03 TIP on June 1, 2000. The Assembly recommended adoption of the fourth major amendment to the FFY 2001-2003 TIP in February 2002. On February 14, 2003 the TAC approved minor amendment #7 to the 2001-03 TIP and released the draft 2004-06 TIP for a 30-day public review.

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The formal comment period closed on March 14, 2003. The Planning & Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on April 14, 2003 to take additional comments.

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The TIP prioritizes funding for municipal and state owned transportation projects, which are eligible for federal funding. Generally the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) supports projects at 91% and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) supports projects at 80%. The required 9-20% matching funds are provided from the State of Alaska General Fund.

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Draft 2004-06 TIP highlighting references are illustrated by red highlighted text for proposed project description and phasing changes. Proposed new projects are illustrated by yellow shading. Completed projects during the 2001-03 TIP are illustrated by blue highlighted text. Comment boxes are also included in the proposed tables.

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The 2004-06 illustrative program years represented in the current 2001-03 TIP serve as the foundation for the 2004-06 program.

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- The 2004-06 TIP utilizes ADOT proposed funding of 27.8% provided to AMATS last fall during the statewide allocation formula discussion. This funding equates to \$56,270,000 in 2004,
- 32 \$57,751,000 in 2005 and \$59,276,000 in 2006 for roadway improvements, enhancements and

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Congestion Management and Air Quality (CMAQ) projects. As always, these funding estimates 1 can change at any time based on the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program. 2 3 Per Policy Committee direction, all 2001-03 roadway and transportation enhancement projects 4 are carried forward into the 2004-06 program. 5 6 The project nomination process was limited to staff nominations for Congestion Management & 7 Air Quality (CMAQ) program. The CMAQ criteria developed by the Citizens' Air Quality 8 Committee are utilized in the development of the program. 9 10 Regarding the selection of "new" projects for the roadway and enhancement program, project 11 selection came from the most recent Municipal Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The CIP 12 utilized an extensive project nomination process similar to the one used to develop recent TIPs. 13 Recommendations from the 2001 Ship Creek Multi-Modal Transportation Plan, the draft 2002 14 Chugiak/Eagle River LRTP and from staff are also utilized in the 2004-06 TIP. 15 16 Each new project was scored utilizing the approved AMATS' roadway and enhancement 17 18 criteria. 19 The proposed tables show a balanced program for each year. Individual table highlights are 20 listed below: 21 22 Table 3a – Road Transfer Program 23 Initial funding for the projects in this table were proposed to be above and beyond AMATS' 24 normal allocation. 25 26 An amendment to the 2001-03 program added funding for projects 2-7. Project description 27 language has been added for those projects. However, the anticipated funding for these 28 additions has not been incorporated into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program. 29 In the interim, \$970,000 in 2003 funding from Table 3, project #15 is used to supplant previously 30 expected funding in Table 3a. 31 32 Additionally, an estimated \$3,870,000 is needed to complete the Victor Road project in 2005. 33 Proposed supplemental funding to complete the project is contained in Table #3, project #15. 34 35 Table 3b & Table 11 - Highway Safety Improvement Program (Set-Aside) 36 ADOT staff has completely restructured this table in an effort to better illustrate the program 37 deliverability. Proposed funding for projects contained in Table 3b are above and beyond 38 AMATS' normal allocation and are pre-draft Statewide Transportation Improvement Program 39 (STIP) funding levels. 40

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Table 3c - Major Non-National Highway System Arterial Rut Repair 1 The A/C Couplet and Boniface Parkway rehabilitation projects (projects #25 and #26) previously 2 contained in Table #3 have been moved into Table 3c. Proposed funding for these projects are 3 above and beyond AMATS' normal allocation and are pre-draft STIP funding levels. 4 5 Table 3 - Roadway Improvements 6 Funds are programmed for two projects should the EAST study identify them as preferred 7 alternatives when the study concludes this spring. Those projects are the Abbott Loop Road 8 reconstruction/extension to Tudor Road and the Dowling Road reconstruction/extension to 9 10 Abbott Loop Road. 11 New projects are shown with yellow shading and placed at the bottom of the table. Roadway 12 improvement projects represent 71.8% of the proposed program allocation. 13 14 Table 4 – Enhancement projects 15 Regarding the Coastal Trail south extension project, the draft TIP does not program any new 16 funding for the project since the public comment period for the draft Environmental Impact 17 Statement has not yet concluded. 18 19 In addition, at the March 20th Policy Committee meeting a motion to include intent language to 20 the Coastal Trail extension was adopted that reads: 21 22 The AMATS Policy Committee is considering changing the priority 23 ranking of this project to follow those projects necessary for completion of 24 major neighborhood trails (to follow projects 1 through 11). 25 26 New projects are shown with yellow shading and placed at the bottom of the table. 27 Enhancements represent 14.2% of the proposed program. 28 29 Table 5 - Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) projects 30 A new proposed program is included based on a new criteria adopted by the Citizens' Air 31 Quality Advisory Committee. The new criteria will need to be formally adopted by the TAC 32 and Policy Committee before the proposed TIP is adopted. 33 34 CMAQ projects represent 14% of the proposed program. 35 36 Table 6 - National Highway System 37 Contains numerous funding changes for the 2003 program, per STIP amendment #17. ADOT 38 staff provided new project estimates for the 2004-06 program. 39

Table 7 – Federal Transit and Railroad projects 1 People Mover and Alaska Railroad staff provided updated project costs. Railroad funding of 2 \$1,500,000 in 2003 for the Ship Creek Trail project moves into 2004 and 2005. 3 4 Per the request of the Federal Transit Administration, \$12,505,000 in 2001 funding for the 5 MP127-MP146 Eagle River to Knik River (5309 New Start) program has been moved to 2003. 6 7 Table 8 - Other Federal and State funded projects 8 9 New projects include: \$36,100,100 in GARVEE bond funding for 'C' Street Phase III; 10 \$37,500,000 in state general obligation funding for Abbott Loop Reconstruction/extension 11 (Abbott Road to 48th Avenue); 12 \$1,883,800,000 in anticipated Congressional Earmark funding for the Knik Arm Crossing 13 project. This project has been moved from the National Highway System (Table 6); 14 \$25,000,000 in anticipated Congressional High Priority funding for transportation 15 improvements associated with the Creekside Town Center. 16 17 Regarding the 'C' Street Phase III project, \$36,100,000 in GARVEE bond funding was approved 18 last November for C Street Phase III, Dimond Blvd. to O'Malley Road, including an interchange 19 at the road and a grade separation for the Alaska Railroad near 68th Avenue and C Street. 20 21 The latest cost estimate for the entire project is \$50,750,000: 22 \$39,750,000 for the extension and interchange 23 \$11,000,000 for the grade separation 24 25 The entire project is funded in the TIP as follows: 26 **Road Extension** 27 \$3,150,000 Table 3 (Project #2) 28 29 Table 8 (Project G) \$31,100,000 30 31 Interchange Table 6 (Project #7) \$5,500,000 32 33 Grade-Separation 34 \$5,000,000 Table 8 (Project H) 35 \$6,000,000 36 Table 3 (Project #3) 37 38 Table 9 - Other projects outside of AMATS 39
