A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY SUPPORTING THE BUCKLE UP ALASKA AND CLICK IT OR TICKET CAMPAIGNS

WHEREAS, in the year 2000, an estimated 11,889 lives were saved by seatbelts and 316 lives of children under five were saved by child restraints; and

WHEREAS, 103 Alaskans were killed in car crashes in 2000, representing a 30% increase from the previous year; and

WHEREAS, even though Alaska laws require children to be properly restrained in seat belts or car safety seats, six out of ten kids who die in crashes are completely unrestrained; and

WHEREAS, in 2000, 10,861 children under the age of 16 were involved in motor vehicle crashes in Alaska and 5,266 of them were injured or killed. More than 567 of these children were not buckled up at the time of the crash, and children are being injured because adults are breaking the law; and

WHEREAS, clearly the existence of child passenger laws, by themselves are not enough to get Alaskans buckled up. Strengthening enforcement of the laws is the single most effective way to bolster the impact of existing laws and to save hundreds of young lives from injury and death every year; and

WHEREAS, polls have repeatedly shown that the American public overwhelmingly supports strong enforcement of child passenger safety laws. The public believes society has a duty to protect children and ensure drivers take the necessary steps to keep kids safe in motor vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:

Section 1: That the Anchorage Assembly supports making automobile occupant safety a priority in Anchorage through highly visible enforcement and the adoption of a policy of zero tolerance for unbuckled kids.

Section 2: That this body whole-heartedly endorses the Buckle Up Alaska and Click It or Ticket Campaigns to assist for a safe Memorial Day weekend.
