### ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR No. 2003 - 186

A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY TO APPROPRIATE SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$66,000) FROM THE HERITAGE LAND BANK GENERAL FUND (221) TO THE HERITAGE LAND BANK CAPITAL FUND (421) FOR FACILITY DEMOLITION AND ENVIRONMENTAL CLEAN-UP ON HLB PARCEL #4-022 (FORMER SITE OF THE MABEL T. CAVERLY SENIOR CENTER), AND AMENDING THE 2003 GENERAL GOVERNMENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BUDGET AND AMENDING THE 2003-2008 GENERAL GOVERNMENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGET.

WHEREAS, the Mabel T. Caverly Senior Center was vacated in 2002 by the Older Persons Action Group, which was situated on HLB Parcel #4-022; and

WHEREAS, the current structure underwent a hazardous materials (HAZMAT) study completed end of 2002, which revealed a significant amount of hazardous materials, including the presence of lead-based paint, and asbestos contained in the walls, floor, ceiling and in the roof; and,

WHEREAS, contractors hired to consider moving the structure indicated that there were significant structural flaws, preventing the safe relocation of the building;

WHEREAS, Anchorage Historic Properties, Inc. has examined the property and concluded that, when compared to other similarly old structures in the Anchorage area, the structure does not merit attempts for historic preservation; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska is contemplating road widening or landscaping enhancements that would include a portion of the property; and

WHEREAS, the 2003 General Government Capital Improvement Budget was approved November 26, 2002 [AO 2002-141(S-2)], and which, at the time of approval did not anticipate monetary support for this project on HLB Parcel #4-022; and

WHEREAS, the 2003-2008 Capital Improvement Program was also approved November 26, 2002 [(AR 2001-297(S-2)], and which at the time of approval did not anticipate monetary support for this project,

SUBJECT: AR 2003- 186 : RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY TO APPROPRIATE SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$66,000) FROM THE HERITAGE LAND BANK GENERAL FUND (221) TO THE HERITAGE LAND BANK CAPITAL FUND (421) FOR FACILITY DEMOLITION AND ENVIRONMENTAL CLEAN-UP ON HLB PARCEL #4-022 (FORMER SITE OF THE MABEL T. CAVERLY SENIOR CENTER), AND AMENDING THE 2003 GENERAL GOVERNMENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BUDGET AND AMENDING THE 2003-2008 GENERAL GOVERNMENT CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGET.

The attached Assembly Resolution is to provide a contribution from the Heritage Land Bank (HLB) of up to \$66,000 for structure demolition and environmental clean-up of the former site of the Mabel T. Caverly Senior Center, located at 1111 East 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The structure is on Heritage Land Bank property (HLB Parcel #4-022) and currently in HLB's inventory. The facility was under management authority of the Department of Health and Human Services while in use by the senior center.

The facility dates from post-war Fort Richardson, where it was apparently a barracks, then later used as a jail for a period of time in the 1950s. In more recent years, the Older Persons Action Group used it as a senior center, vacating the building late in 2002.

Following vacation of the property by the senior center, a hazardous materials study (HAZMAT) was conducted by Hart Crowser, a local environmental engineering company. A summary of its findings included the following:

- Cement-asbestos shingle siding
- Presence of asbestos in multiple layers of sheet and tile flooring
- Cement-asbestos board (CAB) and heat shield in the library area
- Presumed presence of asbestos in roofing materials (based upon the age of the roof)
- High readings of lead-based paint on exterior and interior window sills and exterior trim

Municipal engineers requested potential contractors to consider moving the structure. Concerns were expressed regarding the structural stability in the event that the building needed to be moved.

Several organizations, including Anchorage Historic Properties, were approached regarding the possibility of preserving the structure. These included architects, urban designers and the State of Alaska Office of History and Archeology. None expressed interest in saving the facility or in preventing the facility's demolition.

At this time also, the State of Alaska's Department of Transportation & Public Facilities office is considering widening the western end of the Glenn Highway. The public process is under way to

determine a route, and if the corridor is widened to take a portion of the HLB lot, little will remain. With a bluff on the north, future commercial use may be limited to parking, at best.

An RFP for demolition was conducted and the bid awarded for \$65,600 to CYS Management Services (see Appendix A). The MOA's Public Works Department is assisting HLB with the demolition process and has recommended razing the structure.

As time has been of the essence in finalizing this process, money has been fronted from the HLB Operating Budget so that demolition could proceed as scheduled. This request is for creation of a separate capital project in the HLB Capital Fund (421) to more appropriately account for this activity as a capital expense. The capital project would essentially reimburse the HLB Operating Budget upon appropriation of support from the HLB General Fund (221), as this money has already been encumbered from the operating budget.

As this request for support post-dates approval of both the 2003 General Government Capital Improvement Budget and the 2003-2008 General Government Capital Improvement Plan on November 26, 2002, the two capital budgets will need to be amended to include this appropriation for 2003 following Assembly approval of the lease.

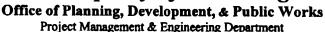
