A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY SUPPORTING IMMEDIATE DIALOGUE BETWEEN THE U.S. ARMY AND THE NORTHEAST AND SCENIC FOOTHILLS COMMUNITY COUNCILS CONCERNING THE PROPOSED FENCE ALONG THE FORT RICHARDSON BOUNDARY EAST OF MULDOON
WHEREAS, the citizens within the Muldoon and East Anchorage areas are strongly supportive of the military's efforts to protect our Nation; and
WHEREAS, Muldoon and East Anchorage residents have been good neighbors to the military throughout the years; and
WHEREAS, the Army has proposed to place a fence along the Fort Richardson boundary East of Muldoon and commence Stryker training in the area; and
WHEREAS, residents have traditionally skied, biked, hunted, hiked, and orienteered in the proposed area to be fenced, and have concerns regarding noise, access to Chugach State Park, wildlife movement, and the aesthetics of a fence close to residents.
NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:
Section 1: That this body requests immediate dialogue between the U.S. Army and the affected Community Councils and that the Administration offer to mediate any such dialogue to reach a mutually satisfactory solution that takes into account local community concerns.

Veto of Assembly Resolution ("AR") No. 2003-217, A Resolution Of The Anchorage Municipal Assembly Supporting Immediate Dialogue Between the U.S. Army and the Northeast and Scenic Foothills Community Councils Concerning the Proposed Fence Along the Fort

Richardson Boundary East of Muldoon ("Resolution").

I hereby veto Assembly Resolution No. 2002-217 referenced above. The reasons for this veto are:

> The U.S. Army and other United States military installations, their officers and personnel have long been dedicated, contributing members of our community with whom residents can and should deal directly;

- The Administration finds no need to "mediate" as direct dialogue with the 2. military is most appropriate; and
- The Joint Armed Services Committee (JASC) of the Alaska legislature 3. informally reviewed this resolution. Their sense was that the Army would be directly engaged with the public, including the Community Councils, and that it was unnecessary for the Municipality to act as an intermediate party. Further, JASC members urged that all concerned recognize the property rights held by US Army Alaska, the importance of the Stryker brigade training areas, and the need to provide practical force protection Man Torce

measures for the military bases.
