### ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO 2004 - 30 (S)

AN ORDINANCE SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS RESIDING IN THE EAGLE CROSSING SUBDIVISION, A BALLOT PROPOSITION TO CREATE A NEW STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA DESIGNATED AS EAGLE CROSSING STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA AND, UPON VOTER APPROVAL, AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 27.30.700 TO CONSOLIDATE EAGLE CROSSING STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA WITH THE EXISTING EAGLE RIVER STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA, RETROACTIVE AS OF JANUARY 1, 2004.

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WHEREAS, the Administration has initiated the creation of the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area: and

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WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to provide for operation and maintenance of street lights in the area known as the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area; and

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WHEREAS, the Eagle Crossing Subdivision is not currently in the Eagle River Street Light Service Area; and

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WHEREAS, the additional street lights to be operated and maintained and the anticipated tax revenue increase will not have a significant impact on the Eagle River Street Light Service Area;

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WHEREAS, the Eagle River Street Light Service Area consists of some seventeen non-contiguous areas in Eagle River, making balloting an extreme hardship for the Municipal Clerk for each and every area to vote on the ballot proposition; and

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WHEREAS, the creation of a new service area approved only by the qualified voters residing in the Eagle Crossing Subdivision, including Block 1, Lots 1-4; Block 2, Lots 1-5; Block 3, Lots 1-17; Block 4, Lots 4-29; Block 6, Lots 1-12; Block 9, Lots 1-1, 11a and 12-33; Block 10, Lots 1-40; Block 11, Lots 1-19, 20A, 20B, 21A, 21B and 22-27; Block 12, Lots 1-26; Block 13, Lots 1-14; Block 14, Lots 1-11, 12A, 12A, 13A, 13B and 14-24; Block 15, Lots 1-22; Block 16, Lots 1-25; Block 19, Lots 1-24; Block 20, Lots 1A, 1B, 2A and 2B; Block 21, Lots 1-35; Tract B; Tracts C 5-10 and 12-13; Tract E2 and E3; Tracts E4A and E5A; Tracts F1A, F1B, F1C, F1E, F1F,G F1H, F1IA, F1J, F1K, F1IA, F1M, F1N,F1O, and F1P; Tracts FA2 and F2B; Tract F3; Tract F4; Tract I; Tract J, Tract M3; Tract 2; Tract 3A; and Tract 4, followed by an automatic

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28 consolidation with the Eagle River Street Light Service Area by the Assembly, provides a manageable and fair mechanism to accomplish incorporating the new service area into the Eagle 29

River Street Light Service Area with no apparent adverse effect on the Eagle River Street Light 30

Service Area; and 31

WHEREAS, the services to be received in the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area are the same level of such services provided in the Eagle River Street Light Service Area; and

WHEREAS, there has been a showing of interest of residents in Eagle Crossing Subdivision area to join the Eagle River Street Light Service Area in order to properly operate and maintain the existing street lights in their area; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to provide for operating and maintaining the street lights in the Eagle Crossing Subdivision area; now therefore,

#### THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to Anchorage Municipal Charter §9.01(a), a ballot proposition containing the following language shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the Municipality residing in Eagle Crossing Subdivision at the regular Municipal election on April 6, 2004:

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APPROVING CREATION OF A NEW SERVICE AREA TO OPERATE AND MAINTAIN STREET LIGHTS IN THE EAGLE CROSSING SUBDIVISION, INCLUDING BLOCK 1, LOTS 1-4; BLOCK 2, LOTS 1-5; BLOCK 3, LOTS 1-17; BLOCK 4, LOTS 4-29; BLOCK 6, LOTS 1-12; BLOCK 9, LOTS 1-1, 11A AND 12-33; BLOCK 10, LOTS 1-40; BLOCK 11, LOTS 1-19, 20A, 20B, 21A, 21B AND 22-27; BLOCK 12, LOTS 1-26; BLOCK 13, LOTS 1-14; BLOCK 14, LOTS 1-11, 12A, 12B, 13A, 13B AND 14-24; BLOCK 15, LOTS 1-22; BLOCK 16, LOTS 1-25; BLOCK 19, LOTS 1-24; BLOCK 20, LOTS 1A, 1B, 2A AND 2B; BLOCK 21, LOTS 1-35; TRACT B; TRACTS C 5-10 AND 12-13; TRACT E2 AND E3; TRACTS E4A AND E5A; TRACTS F1A, F1B, F1C, F1E, F1F,F1G, F1H, F1IA, F1J, F1K, F1LA, F1M, F1N,F1O, AND F1P; TRACTS FA2 AND F2B; TRACT F3; TRACT F4; TRACT I; TRACT J, TRACT M3; TRACT 2; TRACT 3A; AND TRACT 4, RETROACTIVE AS OF JANUARY 1, 2004.


Shall a new street light service area be created retroactively as of January 1, 2004, designated as the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area, not presently in the Eagle River Street Light Service Area, to operate and maintain street lights within the Eagle Crossing Subdivision?

If the creation of this new service area is approved, the new service area will be automatically consolidated with the existing Eagle River Street Light Service Area. The existing mill rate in the Eagle River Street Light Service Area is presently 0.5 mills. Property owners within the new service area will incur an increase in their property taxes to pay for the operation and maintenance of the street lights in the new service area beginning with tax year 2004.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Eagle Crossing Street Light Area is hereby created effective retroactively as of January 1, 2004. Anchorage Municipal Code Section 27.30.700 is hereby amended by

consolidating the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area with the Eagle River Street Light Service Area. Section 1 shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Section 3. Anchorage Assembly. The proposition contained in Section 1 of this ordinance shall be effective retroactively as of January 1, 2004 if, but only if, said proposition is passed by a majority of the voters voting on the question. Section 2 of this ordinance shall become effective retroactively as of January 1, 2004 if, but only if, the proposition in this ordinance becomes effective. **SUBJECT:** 

An Ordinance submitting to the qualified voters residing in Eagle Crossing Subdivision, which is not presently within the Eagle River Street Light Service Area, a ballot proposition to create a new street light service area designated the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area, and amending Anchorage Municipal Code Section 27.30.700 to consolidate the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area with the existing Eagle River Street Light Service Area, retroactive as of January 1, 2004.

The Section 1. of the substituted Ordinance 2004-30(S) expands on the description of the Eagle Crossing Subdivision by individual lots to insure that all property owners would have the opportunity to vote on the ballot proposition and, if the proposition is passed, the proper property owners would be sent the correct 2004 tax bills. The description will alleviate a past problem of not sending the correct tax bills to the proper owners. Otherwise, the documents have not been altered.

 The Ordinance creates a new Street Light Service Area retroactively as of January 1, 2004, designated as the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area which currently does not receive any Municipality of Anchorage street light services, to operate and maintain street lights within the Eagle Crossing Subdivision area, and amends Anchorage Municipal Code Section 27.30.700 to automatically consolidate the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area with the Eagle River Street Light Service Area.

Pursuant to Anchorage Municipal Code 21.10.020A., the Administration recommends introduction of the Ordinance to initiate creation of the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area to operate and maintain street lights within the Eagle Crossing Subdivision. The street lights have been inspected by the Municipality and meet Municipal standards for acceptance for operation and maintenance. There are residents currently living within the proposed service area.

Inclusion of the proposed street light service area of the Eagle Crossing Subdivision to the existing Eagle River Street Light Service Area should not have a significant fiscal or operational impact to the Eagle River Street Light Service Area. In addition, this street light system should not present any hardship for the Maintenance and Operations Department. The ordinance will become effective retroactively as of January 1, 2004.

The Eagle River Street Light Service Area does not have a formal board of supervisors who oversee the service area, and all operation and maintenance are administered by the Maintenance and Operations Department through private contractors. In addition, automatic consolidation is a feasible and rational method to efficiently provide for the operation and maintenance services of the existing street lights. The services to be received in the Eagle Crossing Street Light Service Area will be the same level of such services provided in the Eagle River Street Light Service Area

The consolidation of the street light service area is in conformance with municipal legislative policy to minimize the number of new service areas, especially when it is feasible and practical to consolidate accordingly.

THE ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDS THE APPROVAL OF THIS ORDINANCE AND SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS RESIDING IN EAGLE CROSSING SUBDIVISION, WHICH IS NOT PRESENTLY WITHIN THE EAGLE RIVER STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA, A BALLOT PROPOSITION TO CREATE A NEW STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA DESIGNATED EAGLE CROSSSING STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA, AND AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 27.30.700 TO CONSOLIDATE EAGLE CROSSING STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA WITH THE EXISTING EAGLE RIVER STREET LIGHT SERVICE AREA, RETROACTIVE AS OF JANUARY 1, 2004.
