2 **THE QUALIFIED VOTERS RESIDING IN THE GIRDWOOD VALLEY SERVICE AREA**
3 **(GVSA) AT THE REGULAR ELECTION ON APRIL 6, 2004, A BALLOT PROPOSITION**
4 **ESTABLISHING THE MAXIMUM ATTAINABLE MILL LEVY RATE FOR THE GVSA AND**
5 **AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 27.30.020 UPON VOTER**
6 **APPROVAL OF THE BALLOT PROPOSITION.**

9 **THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:**

11 **Section 1.** That a ballot proposition in substantially the following form shall be submitted
12 to the qualified voters residing in the Girdwood Valley Service Area at the regular municipal election
13 on April 6, 2004.

20 Shall the Girdwood Valley Service Area (GVSA) establish a maximum attainable
21 mill levy rate, effective January 1, 2004, not to exceed 6.0 mills.

26 **Section 2.** That AMC 27.30.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27
28 **27.30.020 Girdwood Valley Service Area.**

30 There is established a service area within the municipality to be the Girdwood Valley Service
31 Area (GVSA) of the municipality, as outlined on the map located in Section 27.30.700. The
32 following powers shall be exercised within the service area: street construction and
33 maintenance, solid waste collection, fire protection and parks and recreation (effective
34 January 1, 1979). The Girdwood Valley Service Area shall establish a maximum attainable
35 mill levy rate not to exceed 6.0 mills.

1 **Section 3.** Section 2 of this ordinance shall become effective upon certification of the
2 regular election held April 6, 2004 if, but only if, the proposition set forth in Section 1 is approved
3 by a majority of the qualified voters voting on the proposition. The remainder of this ordinance shall
4 become effective upon passage and approval.




