ORDINANCE NO. AO 2004-35

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF TWO MILLION AND NO/00 DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF PUBLIC SAFETY FACILITIES (POLICE) AND RELATED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA AND THE QUESTION OF AN INCREASE IN THE MUNICIPAL TAX CAP LIMITATION TO PAY ASSOCIATED OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE COSTS AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 6, 2004.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed TWO MILLION AND NO/00 DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) for the purpose of paying the costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for and equipping public safety facilities and related police protection capital improvements within the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area.

Section 2. The sum of not to exceed Two Million and no/00 Dollars (\$2,000,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality of Anchorage for the aforesaid facility improvements and construction, and related police protection capital improvements, and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for capital improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in

the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due. The principal of and interest on the bonds are to be paid first from general ad valorem taxes levied and collected within the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area.

Section 3. An election is to be held on April 6, 2004, in and for the Municipality of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting, both in the Metropolitan Anchorage Police Service Area and areawide, on the question to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

PROPOSITION NO. _____

ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA FACILITIES BONDS

Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$2,000,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds to pay the costs of public safety facilities and related police protection capital improvements and increase the municipal tax cap by an annual amount up to \$36,000 to pay for associated annual operations and maintenance costs? The proposed capital improvements would be located within the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area.

The annual increase in taxes on \$100,000 of assessed real and personal property value (based on the estimated 2004 assessed valuation in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area): (i) necessary to retire the proposed debt is approximately \$0.82 and (ii) an annual increase in the municipal tax cap (Charter 14.03(b)(2)) of approximately \$0.17 to pay for annual operation and maintenance costs related to the proposed capital improvements.

The debt shall be paid from real and personal property taxes levied and collected in the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area. Anchorage will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the bonds.
