ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2004- 97

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 4.60.220 TO RENAME THE COMMISSION, REDUCE THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS TO ELEVEN, REQUIRE FOUR ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY LIAISONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 4.60.220 is amended to read (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

4.60.220 Municipal military and veterans affairs commission.

There is established a municipal military and veterans affairs commission Α. consisting of not more than 11 [15] members. Members shall be honorably discharged United States military veterans, [OR ACTIVE] reserve or National Guard members not covered by 10 U.S.C. § 973(b)(1), with a demonstrated interest in veterans affairs. All members shall be appointed by the mayor and confirmed by the assembly. Members initially appointed shall serve one-year The Mayor shall invite four active duty military liaisons to the Commission. The participation of these liaisons does not constitute the holding of civil office, nor shall they exercise any sovereign power of the Municipality. An active duty military liaison is not entitled to vote on any question to be determined by the board or commission nor is a liaison a member for the purpose of establishing a quorum of the commission. The mayor shall consult with and ask the [COMMANDERS OF THE] Alaska[N] [AIR] Command Commander to appoint three active duty military liaisons, and the Adjutant General of the Alaska National Guard to appoint one active duty National Guard liaison to the commission [SIXTH INFANTRY DIVISION (LIGHT) SHALL BE ASKED TO APPOINT A MEMBER OF THEIR SERVICE TO ACT AS LIAISON TO THE COMMISSION].

B. The commission shall:

- 1. Establish liaison between the municipal government and the <u>active duty</u> <u>military and</u> veterans' <u>communities</u> [COMMUNITY].
- 2. Inform the mayor and the assembly of matters concerning the municipality's active duty military, veterans and their families.
- 3. Undertake efforts to open and maintain channels of communication

with the <u>active duty military and</u> veterans <u>communities</u> [COMMUNITY] of the municipality and to periodically hold hearings on matters of importance to <u>those communities</u> [THAT COMMUNITY], the <u>municipal government</u>, and Anchorage [COMMUNITY] as a whole[, AND THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT].

- 4. Report at least annually to the mayor and the assembly on <u>active duty</u> military and veterans' issues.
- 5. In conjunction with the <u>active duty military and</u> veteran communities conduct various public relations activities to inform the citizens of the municipality of <u>military and</u> veterans' contributions to the community and to address problems involving <u>active duty military and</u> veterans in the Anchorage community.
- 6. Make recommendations to the mayor and the assembly for the adoption, change or repeal of municipal laws, rules, regulations, restrictions or other matters affecting the active duty military and veterans' communities [COMMUNITY].

- 10. Provide advice and supervision for, and participate in, municipally sponsored military or veterans' conferences.
- 11. Coordinate with other boards and commissions dealing with <u>active duty</u> military and veterans' issues, when necessary.

- 13. Not take the place of any <u>member of the military, military organization</u>, veteran or veteran organization by action or representation to the assembly.
- [C. THE VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMISSION ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS TITLE SHALL TERMINATE BY OPERATION OF LAW ON JANUARY 17, 1999, UNLESS AFFIRMATIVELY REESTABLISHED OR CONTINUED BY THE ASSEMBLY. PRIOR TO THE TERMINATION, CONTINUATION OR REESTABLISHMENT OF ANY MUNICIPAL BOARD OR COMMISSION, THE ASSEMBLY SHALL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING, RECEIVING TESTIMONY FROM THE GENERAL PUBLIC, MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

THEREOF, AND IN SUCH HEARING THE BOARD OR COMMISSION 1 SHALL HAVE THE BURDEN OF DEMONSTRATING A PUBLIC NEED 2 3 FOR ITS CONTINUED EXISTENCE. 4 (AO No. 88-32(S-1); AO No. 88-185; AO No. 89-1; AO No. 89-155; AO No. 93-3, expires 5 1-17-96; AO No. 95-224, § 1, expires 1-17-99; AO No. 99-6, § 1, expires 1-17-02; AO No. 6 2001-189, § 1, expires 1-17-05) 7 8 State law references: Veterans affairs, AS 26.10.010 et seq. 9 10 The mayor shall reduce the number of members on Military and Veterans' Affairs Section 2. 11 Commission as established in Section 1 by appointing only four members in 2004, four members in 12 2005, and three members in 2006. If convenience and circumstances require, the mayor may appoint 13 three members in a different year than indicated in the previous sentence, and four members in the 14 15 other two years. 16 Section 3. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE Subject: SECTION 4.60.220 TO RENAME THE COMMISSION, REDUCE THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS TO ELEVEN, REQUIRE FOUR ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY LIAISONS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Mayor wishes to acknowledge the importance of active duty military personnel and their contributions to the Municipality of Anchorage. In order to do so, this ordinance reconfigures the Veterans' Affairs Commission by adding a focus on active duty military. Section 1 of the ordinance achieves this by renaming the commission the "Military and Veterans Affairs Commission," and designating four seats for active duty military as liaisons. Because federal law prohibits active duty military from holding civil office and the Judge Advocate General's office has advised that participation as a commissioner may be considered the holding of "civil office" under 10 U.S.C. §973, the ordinance creates liaison seats for active duty military and National Guard personnel. The liaisons are not considered voting members and may not be counted for purposes of constituting a quorum. To maintain the number of persons involved in the commission at fifteen, the number of commissioners is reduced to eleven. The Mayor is to consult with the Alaskan Command Commander and the Adjutant General of the Alaska National Guard in selecting liaisons.

Other language amendments to AMC section 4.60.220 are intended to include the involvement and concerns of active duty military and Alaska National Guard members. In addition, subsection AMC subsection 4.60,220C, is deleted because it is outdated and a redundancy of the section on termination of a board or commission, AMC section 4.05.150.

Section 2 of the ordinance directs that the reduction in Veterans' Affairs Commissioners to eleven will be implemented over the next three appointment years by only appointing either three or four members for new terms. Each year, five commissioners' terms will expire but fewer will be appointed until 2006 when the total will be eleven after appointments that year.
