General Fund (101) Balance to the Economic and Community Development Agency.


Section 2: That this appropriation is to be used as a grant to the Alaska Moving

The Alaska Moving Image Preservation Association (AMIPA) offers a priceless resource for our local community, and has also been recognized by the Federal Government as an agency eligible for funding through matching grants. The organization is requesting that the Municipality provide a \$10,000 challenge grant to be matched 100% by private donations in support of its \$100,000 "sustainable future" campaign. Due to increased preservation activity in Alaska by AMIPA, funds are needed immediately to take advantage of a number of strategic opportunities now available (see attached detailed information).

Municipality of Anchorage Request

March 2, 2004

The Alaska Moving Image Preservation Association is requesting a \$10,000 challenge grant from the Municipality of Anchorage, to be matched 100% by private donations in support of its \$100,000 "Sustainable Future" campaign. Due to increased preservation activity in Alaska by AMIPA, funds are needed immediately to take full advantage of a number of strategic opportunities now available, including:

- Securing completion funding for the "Voices and Images of Alaska" (VIA) project. The Association has been invited to submit a full application to the Murdock Trust for the project, and is also applying to the Paul Allen Foundation for a combined total of \$135,000. Coupled with these funds, a recent grant from the Rasmuson Foundation of \$100,000, as a top off to the \$1M VIA project, will complete the fundraising on this important project of which the MOA is a donor. We expect to secure the final match funds this year, resulting in a major boost in AMIPA activity beginning in the 3rd quarter calendar 2004 (1st quarter, fiscal '05). AMIPA is also working with the Foraker Group to streamline its business plan and maximize earned income.
- The Association of Moving Image Archivists, the pre-eminent North American media archivists' body, is meeting in Anchorage February 29 – March 6 with AMIPA and ACVB on plans to hold their 600-attendee conference in Anchorage in October, 2006. This event will be an important boost for film and video archive efforts in Alaska and AMIPA is working hard at securing this flagship international event. Another major benefit will be the income such a conference will bring to the Anchorage area. AMIPA has been working on securing this conference for Anchorage over the past two and a half years without financial assistance.
- Vaults at AMIPA's future home in the APU/UAA Consortium Library building have recently been commissioned and turned over to UAA. They have met critical temperature and humidity specifications, and AMIPA must complete a full item-level inventory in order to move its collections and offices in August of this year.
- AMIPA was awarded a \$50,000 grant in January through the Institute of Museum and Library Services for a digitization project as part of the federal Omnibus spending bill. The grant is reimbursable and requires increased capacity by AMIPA to take full immediate advantage of this opportunity.

AMIPA will provide a full report to the Municipality in December 2004 on the progress of these projects.
