ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR NO. 2004–58

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY OPPOSING LEGISLATION ESTABLISHING A STATEWIDE TAX ON TOURIST LODGING ACCOMMODATIONS.

WHEREAS, the 23rd Legislature has proposed two bills relating to the levy and collection of an assessment on certain tourism-related and recreation-related goods and services, SB 254 and HB 426; and

WHEREAS, certain sections of SB 254 and HB 426 would enact a levy of a "sustainable tourism and recreation assessment" on the rental of all short-term tourist lodging accommodations; and

WHEREAS, the framers of Alaska's Constitution ensured local control and "maximum local self-government" by the people; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Municipal League's 2004 Policy Statement regarding tax levying authority is in opposition to "any action that would diminish the existing statutory authority of local government to raise needed revenues through the levy of taxes. The League opposes any efforts by the state that would reduce local tax bases. . . . The League supports municipal control over sales and property tax. These taxes are the principle sources of local government revenue, and therefore, require local control"; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Office in a February 4, 2004, letter to the State legislative leadership proposed a 5% transient accommodation tax on cruise ships, shore-side lodging, and tourist activities; and

WHEREAS, a statewide levy of a tax on tourist accommodations would increase the Municipality of Anchorage's bed tax from 8% to a level that would likely prevent the city from raising revenue for tourism-related purposes with an additional increase in the local bed tax; and

WHEREAS, tourists expect to pay their fair share of taxes but not an undue proportion; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage's 2004–2009 Capital Improvement Program includes a new Anchorage Convention Center project to maintain and improve the quality of Anchorage's "community, security, and prosperity" through a ballot proposition increasing the hotel/motel bed tax from 8% to 12%; and

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2004, the Municipality issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a new Alaska Civic and Convention Center with the intention of financing the center in part from public funds from an increase in the local bed tax; and

WHEREAS, the new Convention Center is expected to generate millions of dollars for the economy of Anchorage and the State in construction and co-development jobs.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

The Anchorage Assembly opposes statewide tourism-related taxes on accommodations; and

The Anchorage Assembly endorses careful policy decisions that will develop and nurture tourism's role as a growing source of both employment and government revenue to the benefit of both the State and the Municipality.
