**A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AND
MAYOR MARK BEGICH TO NAME THE APD DOWNTOWN
SUBSTATION THE "OFFICER JONATHON FLORA SUBSTATION"**

WHEREAS, AMC 3.97 establishes a means of recognizing and honoring persons who have substantially contributed to the Municipality of Anchorage by naming municipal owned building, other fixed facilities, and public places after such persons; and

WHEREAS, under AMC 3.97, this naming action may be initiated by a formal request of the Assembly to the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, Officer Flora dedicated himself to community service; and

WHEREAS, Officer Flora was shot to death while investigating a burglary at a drug addiction treatment center in Downtown Anchorage on September 8, 1975; and

WHEREAS, Officer Flora was thirty-two years old at the time of his death and had served the Anchorage Police Department for four years; and

WHEREAS, Officer Flora's widow was responsible for initiating the funding for the creation of Anchorage Police Department's K9 Unit and started a citizen-initiated grassroots movement that became Dollars for Dogs, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the following members of the APD Downtown Substation Naming Committee have met and voted unanimously to name the Substation, the "Officer Jonathon Flora APD Downtown Substation" in keeping with tradition of naming a police substation after fallen APD officers:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:


Section 1. That the APD Downtown Substation be named the Officer Jonathon Flora Substation.
