**A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY
REMEMBERING, HONORING, AND RECOGNIZING THE SERVICE OF ALL
THE MEN AND WOMEN WHO HAVE SERVED THEIR COUNTRY WITH
HONOR AND COURAGE IN THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES.**

WHEREAS, on the morning of December 7, 1941, the Imperial Japanese Navy and Air Force attacked units of the United States Armed Forces stationed at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, thrusting the United States into the Second World War; and

WHEREAS, since that time, countless men and women have served in the United States Armed Forces honorably in war and in peace, carrying out their duty in defense of this great nation; and


WHEREAS, countless more continue to serve at home and abroad in an active duty capacity or in National Guard or Reserve units; and

WHEREAS, Federal legislation was enacted in 1994 designating each December the 7th as "National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day."
